MAYOR'S OFFICE. Alexandria, Va., Oct. 20, 1874. Notice is hereby given that the provisions of the following section of chapter XVI, C. A. 1874, will be enforced on and after the 1st day of November next:

All and each of the following named articles which shall hereafter be sold within the city of Alexandria, shall be sold by weight and not otherwise: Allowing sixty pounds for a bushel of wheat; fifty six pounds for a bushel of corn, shelled, or seventy pounds for a bushel of corn in the ear; forty eight pounds for a bushel of corn meal; fifty six pounds for a bushel of rye; thirty-two pounds for a bushel of oats; forty-eight pounds for a bushel of barley; sixty pounds for a bushel of hominy; fifty-two pounds for a bushel of buckwheat; fifty pounds for a bushel of Irish potatoes; fifty-five pounds for a bushel of sweet potatoes; sixty pounds for a bushel of beans or peas; twenty pounds for a bushel of bran; fifty seven pounds for a bushel of onions; twenty pounds for a bushel of dried apples, and twenty-three pounds for a bushel of dried peaches. Any person or persons who shall sell or offer for sale any wheat, corn, meal, barley, hominy, buckwheat, Irish potatoes, sweet potatoes, beans, peas, bran, onions, dried apples or dried peaches in any manner other than herein prescribed shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty dollars, nor less than two dollars for every such offence.
