SOCIAL LIFE AMONG ANIMALS.

We glean the following amusing scraps from a highly interesting paper read at a late public sitting of the Brussels Academy of Sciences by M. van Beneden, and published in the Revue Scientifique. There exists, he remarks, a great analogy between human society and that of animals. In the latter we find, quite as often as in our world, an honest set earning their livelihood by their industry; but there is another set of idlers and vagabonds that live off their busy neighbors. Some are parasites and feed on their vitals, others are content to sit at the same table and enjoy the good things before them. That fact is not unusual, carpenters, masons and architects among the lower creation, is a well known fact; but we may be startled to find among their manufacturers of paper (a sort of South American wasp, the Charterius chertarius), and shipbuilders (a sort of fish discovered by Agassiz, that builds itself a floating nest of sea weeds), &c. We have the cheat that leads the life of great gentleness (the cuckoo and penguin); the humble pickpocket (the magpie), and the ruthless highwayman (the tiger, shark, &c.) But there are some that cannot live without being a burden to others; such are certain crustacea, like the copepoda, that will stick to an ascidian and partake of its prey; or the fish called "remora," that will anchor itself to the body of a great swimmer, and let itself be conveyed along without any personal trouble, catching its prey from its snail berth.

Others there are that will do a friend a neighborly service; such is a kind of plover, that will enter a crocodile's mouth, and cleanse its teeth of the remains of its last breakfast, a service the saurian cannot perform itself because of the stiffness of its tongue; so that it has the advantage of a living tooth-pick. This fact is mentioned by Aristotle, and has since been found true. Among parasites properly so-called, there are many that do not take to their roguish mode of living till they get old; until then they roam about in perfect liberty. Sometimes, like the hypoxys, a sort of crustacea, both male and female, will seek together a refuge for their old age to another organism of their kind; at others, it is only the female that does so, while the male remains at large; this is the case of the worm filaria of Medina. The female will sometimes, as in the case of the leucaria, carry her male about with her; and as she feeds on her amphipod host, then leave it and take up their abode to another; getting tired of this, in a third, and so on till they tire of their fathers.


