ASSESSMENT OF LAND.
AN Act to amend and reenact sections 1, 5, and 6 of chapter 62 of the Code of 1873, and to repeal sections 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 of said chapter, in relation to the assessment of the lands of the Commonwealth.—Approved March 31, 1875.

1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly, That sections 1, 5 and 6 of chapter 32 of the Code of 1873 be amended and reenacted so as to read as follows:

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the several county and corporation courts, and of the Hustings Court of the city of Richmond, at their June and July terms, in the year 1875, and every fifth year thereafter, to appoint proper persons to assess the cash value of all lands and lots, together with the improvements thereon, within their respective counties and corporations; Provided, That there shall be but one assessor for each corporation, except the city of Richmond, where there shall be three, and for each county as many as there are commissioners of the revenue for the same. Add no person shall be appointed assessor for any county or corporation who is not a resident or a freeholder of the same. In those counties in which two or more assessors are to be appointed the court shall appoint one for each district to which a commissioner of the revenue shall be assigned.

Section 5. As soon as the assessors shall have completed the assessments in their respective counties, districts, or corporations they shall make two copies of the assessments in the form in which the land-books are now made out, and shall certify on oath that no lots or lands are omitted and that there are no errors on its face; and of those copies one certified one shall be filed and presented in the clerk's office of the county or corporation, and the other forwarded by mail or other State conveyance to the Auditor of Public Accounts at Richmond on or before the 1st of December in the year in which the assessment is made: Provided, That for good cause shown the judges of the county, and corporation courts of this Commonwealth may extend the time of making the returns of said assessment to the 1st of January next succeeding. Each assessor who shall fail to comply with any requisition of this section shall forfeit all right to compensation for his services.—It shall be the duty of the Auditor of Public Accounts as soon as possible after the passage of this act to prepare proper forms of returns so arranged as to show the lands and lots in each commissioner of the revenue's district separately, with blanks to be filled up by the assessors, and cause the same, with proper instructions, to be printed, and forward a sufficient number of copies for the use of the assessors to the clerks of the courts of the several counties and corporations.

Section 6. Any person feeling himself aggrieved by the assessment of his lands or lots made under the provisions of this act may, upon giving notice to the assessor, apply to the court by which the assessor was appointed, at the first, second, or third term after such assessment shall be made, and not after, to have the assessments of his lands or lots corrected; which notice shall be in writing, and shall have appended thereto an affidavit that in the opinion of the affiant the assessment of his lands or lots is above the true value thereof; which affidavit may be sworn to by the owner or his duly authorized agent. In all such applications it shall be the duty of the Attorney for the Commonwealth to protect the interest of the Commonwealth. And if the court shall be satisfied that the assessment is too high it shall reduce the same to what is in its opinion the true value of such lands or lots; but if it shall be of opinion that the assessment is too low, then it shall increase in like manner. And such application shall have precedence over all other causes pending in said court. In any case in which the owner of lands or lots, or his agent be dissatisfied with the value assessed because it is too low, the assessors shall adopt the estimate of the owner or his agent; but in case of appeal from the decision to court, as herein provided for costs shall not be taken for or against the appellant or the Commonwealth.

Sections 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 of chapter 31 of the Code of 1873 are hereby repealed.

POTATOES.—A correspondent tells the Fruit Recorder that for many years past he has made a practice (having received a lesson from Jack Frost) of mowing off close to the ground all his potato tops, both in field and garden, when they are about two or three inches in height, taking a hot sunny day, or better, a windy one, when all moisture has evaporated. By this means he avoids the rot and greatly increases the yield, sometimes as much as twenty-five per cent. These results have never failed. With a small quantity, such as he has had only in the garden for two or three years, he has found them to suffer very little from the Colorado pest, leaving nothing to lay their first egg from, which covers nearly all the latter family growth. We are not over-sanguine as to attainment of all these desirable ends by mowing off the potato tops, and especially have doubts about the success of this plan of cheating the potato beetle of his birthright. If his progeny depend on "something to lay their first egg from" during the short time it takes to grow the two inches of potato stalks, potatoes planted a few weeks later would escape the pest entirely. Still it would be very desirable to have this experiment tried on a large scale, and it will take but little time to mow off a row in the field or garden. There can be no loss accrue from this, and it may lead to the establishment of a principle of the greatest importance.
