MEETING OF COMMITTEES.—Messrs. L. McKenzie and S. F. Beach met the colored trustees of Lee and Seaton school buildings, at the room of the City School Board, last night, with reference to the administration of that property.

BRYAN, secretary of the colored trustees, then presented a paper explanatory of the one which had been referred to the committee by the Board, declaring that while the colored trustees would never resign the title, they would apply all the money received from any quarter for rents to repairing and refurbishing the school rooms, &c., under the control and direction of the public school authorities.
