FRIDAY EVENING, JUNE 16. MAN'S DEGRADATION.—Mr. St. G. Mivart in his recent publication, Lessons from Nature, makes a statement somewhat to this effect: That physical science, and not theology, have indicated him to assign a greater scope to degradation than that assigned to it by general authors. He advances the idea that profound moral corruption can exist with the most varied appliances of a complex civilization, and brings forward as proof this France under the reign of Louis Bonaparte. Contrasting these conditions with the pure and lofty morality of the Pyrolean peasant, whose mental civilization is but slight, Mr. Mivart says: "We have but to develop this in a somewhat further to see a family of the stone age, clothed in a few skins, ignorant of the sciences, and innocent of all but the rudest art, yet possessed of a moral integrity but very exceptionally present amid the population of the greatest cities of modern times."
