THE FUNERAL OF THE LATE MRS F. L. SMITH, JR.—In the course of a varied experience as a public journalist it has seldom devolved upon us to chronicle such a spontaneous tribute of affection to the memory of the dead as that which was witnessed on Sunday morning last at the Main Street M. E. Church, on the occasion of the funeral services of Mrs. Jennie Sutherland Smith. By a kindred impulse which pervaded every grief-stricken heart the customary religious services were omitted at all the other churches, and the ministers and members of the various denominations consolidated themselves into one sympathizing mass to unite in paying the last tribute of respect to one whose sterling social worth rendered her an ornament to society and whose triumphant death illustrated the excellence of Christianity. Rev. Alexander Martin, D. D., of the Presbyterian Church, Rev. Mr. Chapin, of the Baptist Church, and Rev. Mr. Bledsoe, of the Lutheran M. E. Church, assisted the Rev. S. S. Lambeth in conducting the funeral services. These good men performed the parts allotted them with the most impressive solemnity, and it is seldom in the course of a lifetime that one is permitted to witness an occasion fraught with such sad and solemn associations.—*Dunville News.*

HAPPY INCIDENT.—The Richmond correspondent of the Petersburg Post, in his account of the late visit of the Richmond City Guard to Norfolk, says:

One of the events of the occasion was the formal presentation of the Richmond City Guard to Mrs. Oliver J. Schoolcraft, the wife of Lieutenant Schoolcraft, of whom so much has recently been said in the papers. The company was marched into the parlor of the Atlantic Hotel, where Lieutenant and Mrs. Schoolcraft were waiting for them. The company was halted in the room, and the command was given "Doff caps." Lieut. Schoolcraft then advanced and introduced Captain Taylor to his wife. Mrs. Schoolcraft said, "Captain Taylor, I hope there is a vacancy in your ranks, so that I can join the company." Captain Taylor replied: "There is, madam, we will make you daughter of the regiment."

Mrs. Schoolcraft: "But I wish to be captain."
Captain Taylor: "You shall be captain."
The company was then marched out. Shortly after Mrs. Schoolcraft was presented by the company with an exquisite basket of flowers and fruits beautifully arranged. Mr. Schoolcraft commanded the City Guard when that company went to church.

TROOPS IN THE SOUTH.—A general order just issued by General Sherman directs that on assuming command of the Department of the South on or about September 1st, Gen. Thomas H. Ruger, Colonel of the Eighteenth Infantry, shall transfer the headquarters of the department from Louisville, Ky., to Atlanta, Ga. The companies of the Second Infantry now in the Department of the Gulf—Louisiana and Mississippi—will be transferred to the Department of the South, and the headquarters and companies of the Sixteenth Infantry now in Kentucky and Tennessee will be transferred to the Department of the Gulf. This is in accordance with the recent instructions from the Secretary of War, disposing of the troops in the Southern States for use in any emergency. Col. Perry Pecker, Sixteenth Infantry, at present commanding the Department of the South, has directed the following movement of companies: Companies A and E, Eighteenth Infantry, from Atlanta, Georgia, to Edgefield, South Carolina; Company K, Eighteenth Infantry, from Greenville to Laurensville, Laurens county, S. C.; Company E, Fifth Army, from Summerville, and Company H, Eighteenth Infantry, from Columbia to Blackville, Barnwell county, S. C. These troops will go into camp at the points to which they are ordered, and will be supplied with sixty days' rations.

ANGRY WORDS.—The Washington Chronicle gives the following account of a wordy encounter that took place in that city, Monday, between two radicals hailing from this State: "Two Virginia gentlemen met by accident yesterday at the National Hotel, and a serious encounter was at one time threatened, but the affair was bridged over, at least for the present, without damage to either party. The belligerent gentlemen were Messrs. T. Humphrey Brooke and Charles H. Wolz, and the difficulty arose from a publication said to have been made by Brooke in the Sunday Gazette, of this city, sometime since, in relation to John W. Wolz, postmaster at Fredericksburg and Republican candidate for Congress from that district."
