RESURRECTED SKELETONS.—The Academy of Sciences of this city, through some of its more active members, has recently made some very interesting discoveries upon the summit of the bluff north of, and about four miles distant from this city. Judge E. P. West, a believer in the evolution theory, has devoted a large amount of time and study to this subject, and his persistent researches and constant efforts, aided as they have been by other members of the Academy of Science, have brought to light some very interesting historical facts. Several ossified moulds were found, and upon opening up the explorers took out the remains of two skeletons. The bones are very large—so large, in fact, that when compared with an ordinary skeleton of modern date they appear to have formed part of a giant. The head bones such as have not rotted away are monstrous in size. The lower jaw of one skeleton is in a state of preservation and is double the size of the jaw of a civilized person. The teeth in this jawbone are large, and appear to have been ground down and worn away by contact with rocks and a carious food. The jawbone indicates immense muscular strength. The thigh bone, when compared with that of an ordinary modern skeleton, looks like that of a horse. The length, thickness and muscular development are remarkable. But the most peculiar part about the skeleton is the frontal bone, it is very low, and differs radically from any ever seen in this section before. It forms one thick ridge of bone about one inch wide, extending across the eyes. It is narrow but rather heavy ridge of bone which, instead of extending upward, as it does now in the days of civilization, receded back from the eyebrows, forming a flat head, and thus indicates a very low order of mankind. It is the opinion of the dissectionist gentlemen who are making these discoveries that these bones are the remains of a pre-historic race of men. They do not resemble the present existing race of Indians, nor are the moulds constructed upon pattern or model known to have been in use by any race of men now in existence in America. The bodies are discovered in a sitting posture in the moulds, and among the bones are found stone weapons, such as flint knives, flint scrapers, all of them different in shape to the modern heads, war hatchets and other stone tools and weapons known to have been in use by the aboriginal Indians of this land when discovered by the whites. It is pretty definitely settled, however, that the skeletons are those of a race of men not now in existence.—*Kansas Times.*

A CHINESE WAY OF DEALING WITH CORRUPT OFFICERS.—The following extract from a China paper gives a picture of paternal government in that country, in which the pretext of not sparing the rod is carried into practice in a way which ought to strike terror into the hearts of the official hierarchy. The bamboo has long been known as an effective instrument for governing the masses and the correction of offenders against the Chinese code, but there is something novel as well as startling in the idea of a degraded official being made to hold out his hands for a hundred blows, to be administered on the palms as a preliminary castigation for malversation. It such a mode of dealing with official malpractices were to become general we might soon hope to see a notable improvement in the administrative departments which, in China, are so notoriously bad and corrupt. We learn that one of the mandarins there, who had swindled the government of a large sum of money when making purchases of warlike materials at Hong Kong during the Formosa affair, was brought up for trial before the redoubtable Ping and the Fung. On the 4th of August this degraded official was subjected, as an introduction to something severe in store for him, to a flogging of one hundred blows on the back, but for his bitter crying and vehement entreaties, coupled with the fact of his not being in very good health. The degrading official is surnamed Nan, and is related to a Tautai of that name who was degraded at the same time with the Viceroy Yung Han in the Wasing affair.

There is bad medicine at Changchow. The officials arrested eight magicians, or paper men, and threw them into prison. There was a female accomplice, and inasmuch as the general theory that a woman cannot keep a secret is one of the oldest axioms of Chinese philosophy, the mandarin determined to treat her leniently in the hope of coaxing enormous Chinese bribes from her. Upon her ribs, concealed elsewhere on her person were sprites of paper and brass, and these, it seems, were the instruments wherewith she conjured. "Make me a full confession," said the mandarin, "and I pledge you my word that you shall escape unharmed." "You shall know all about it tonight," replied the maiden. She tied a string to a paper sprite and muttered an incantation; in about fifteen minutes the thing of paper became a thing of life, moving, fluttering, growing, flying, until it was an enormous kite. Then she took one of the brass medallions; it moved and screeled; there was a dreadful sound like the tramp and clatter of an armed host marching in midair. The poor mandarin saw and heard it all, but he understood nothing. The woman kept the secret. The mandarin was executed.
