BY TELEGRAPH.

The Contemplated Fraud. WASHINGTON, Nov. 16, 2:30 p. m.—Still nothing definite in reference to the three contested Southern States, nor is there any likelihood of dis-pelling the cloud that overhangs them, within any definite period. There is much gloom here, and many forebodings of evil, it being considered very possible that the Radicals will be able to carry out their design of thwarting the popular will by their giving to Hayes the electoral votes of Louisiana, Florida and South Carolina.

NEW YORK, Nov. 16.—The Herald has a dispatch from J. J. Daniel, chairman democratic executive committee, Second District, Florida, containing the vote of the State by counties. The returns are all in, except from Broward, which is democratic and casts less than a hundred votes. The first Congressional district gives a democratic majority of 606. The second Congressional district gives a democratic majority in the State 1,038. This insures the election of the State and national tickets, democratic Congressmen from both districts and a democratic majority in both Houses of the Legislature. The Herald's Tallahassee dispatch says it is impossible that the Radicals can be cut below 300 or Tilden's below 400. The democrats have filed elaborate protests against the legality of the vote of Leon and Jefferson counties, each covering a Republic majority of 2,000. The bill of exceptions against Jefferson county is particularly ample containing ten specific counts. This evening Mr. M. Wade, Mr. Salt- stall, of Boston, Mr. Coyle, of Washington, and Mr. Sellers, of Philadelphia, arrived. The Herald's Columbia, S. C. dispatch says: The democratic manager of elections in Laurens county, yesterday, stated before the board of State canvassers that W. H. Rutherford, a mulatto republican, was elected messenger to carry the county returns to Columbia but that he is now in the city he refuses to turn over the report to the Secretary of State. The board replied verbally to the statement that it could not verify and that the democrats would have to seek their remedy elsewhere. An application was also submitted to the board of State canvassers by the democrats for the counting of the votes by clerks appointed by each party. The board made no answer, but in reply to another protest against their character, as having judicial functions, they adopted the following resolution: Resolved, That the board will not act upon any proposition until the question of its powers and duties be decided by the Supreme Court.

The board then adjourned. Eight or ten of the democratic visitors called upon Gov. Kellogg to-day, and had a long interview. The Governor confided himself to exhibiting and explaining the law, and stated that he had no objection over the personal or organizational part of the law. The returning board will meet to-morrow morning at the State House, and a disposition of troops for their protection has been made by Gen. Sheridan, with Gen. Peaymaster as second in command. The city is perfectly quiet. Senators Kelly and Sherman, and Messrs. Staughton, Halo and Kaseau arrived to-day. It has now a finally decided by the Democratic visitors to entrust their case to Messrs. Tynan, P. Mear, and Potter, who will remain here to watch and conduct it. All the other gentlemen now here in that interest will probably return in the course of a few days. The policy to be followed subsequently will be a matter of future consideration, which the National Committee will probably dictate. The democrats claim Tilden will carry a sufficient electoral vote of South Carolina to elect him, but will not discuss any reasons for this assertion. The republicans now consoled the election of Hampton on the face of the returns, but claim that the remainder of the republican State ticket is elected.

The Times' New Orleans dispatch says the following dispatch was sent to an Indianapolis paper, last night: "The official returns of the election of half the State are in. None of them are opened. Both parties claim the majority for President. The republicans claim three Congressmen and the democrats four. Both claim the Legislature. The returns come in very slowly, by horseback and boat. They may not be in for a week. The returning board meets to-morrow for organization and will be in session for several days, and until the whole vote is canvassed."

NEW YORK, Nov. 16.—A Richmond dispatch says: Owing to alleged irregularities and frauds in the fourth district, Hinton, the democratic candidate for Congress, will contest the election of DeJonghen, republican.

NEW YORK, Nov. 16.—The World has an Aiken, S. C. dispatch saying Deputy U. S. Marshal Bardeen, accompanied by a detachment of troops, started on a tour of four days through Aiken and Barwell counties yesterday.

The World's Jacksonville dispatch claims 1,027 majority for Tilden in Florida.

The World Name. HARTFORD, Nov. 16.—It has been disclosed that on some of the democratic ballots cast in this State the name of Chas. R. Ingersoll, one of the electors, was printed "Ingasoll." In one town nearly all the ballots cast were of this description. How the electors were misled is not known. The canvassers would most likely count these votes for the regular nominee, but the case seems similar to one reported from South Carolina.
