**DEATH OF A BRIDE**—The Greenboro (N. C.) New North Star gives the following account of a remarkably sudden death, recently briefly alluded to in our telegrams: "A very sad occurrence took place at Thomasville on Thursday, Feb. 25. The friends and relatives assembled at the residence of the bride to witness the marriage ceremony of Mr. William D. Thomas and Mrs. Sarah C. Forney. The hour appointed for the solemnization of the service was 3 o'clock p. m. A minute or two before the time, the bridegroom arrived and stepped into the adjoining room from where the friends were gathered, and wishing to have the ties procured at the appointed time, he asked the bride if she was ready. She responded 'Yes,' and immediately suited the action to the word by rising to her feet, laying aside the extra wrapping from her shoulders, and taking the arm of her intended husband. Without another word or moment's delay they stepped out on the floor, when Rev. John W. Lewis began the service. Before he had repeated more than two sentences the bride gave way, and in a moment lay upon the floor in a state of unconsciousness. She was conveyed to a bed, where she remained in that state for two hours, when her spirit responded to the summons of death. Dr. Thomas was present and witnessed the circumstances from the beginning to the last. His version is that it was a fainting spell occasioned from recent illness, and the fall upon the floor produced convulsion of the brain. She was buried at Fair Grove on the 25th.
