Her husband, a broad shouldered man, came forward and attempted to remove her, but she persisted in holding her position. Mr. Murphy handed her a large armchair from the platform, and the woman sat down. Before the proceedings ended the poor woman, partially sobered, persisted in joining the choir, and was assisted to the platform by Mr. Murphy."
Another episode of the evening's exercises was the appearance of a rather obstreperous character, who said he spent more money for drinks than any other man in the city of New York. He gave his name on signing the pledge as Charles W. Edgar. A voice cried out, "Will you stick to it?" Edgar replied, "I never signed anything in my life that I did not stick to. WHY ENGLAND IS NOT MAHOMETAN.—During the evening's chat the Kadi, who was present, pronounced that the Protestant, or as the Moslems generally say, the "English" religion and Islam were very nearly all one—fer he had seen a book at Acre, while waiting an hour in Jemal's house (the American Consul Agent), a native Christian merchant, which distinctly vouched that there but one God—that the Pope is not God's deputy on earth—that it is no duty to confess sins to a priest but to God only—and that the images and pictures in churches are unlawful. "Now," said he, "this is Islam—this is true religion." It was curious to hear a Kadi (judge in Koran law) say so; he also contended that it is a mere matter of custom, not of religion, when Moslems do not salute Christians with the formula, "Salaam 'alaikoum" ("Peace be unto you"). In this he was at one with the Kadi at Nablous, the especially fanatical city of Palestine. It may not be generally known that the Moslems commonly believe that the English are not to blame for not having embraced their great doctrine for it was only owing to their great distance from Arabia that the answer did not arrive in time before his death, when the Prophet had sent them his invitation by letter to embrace Islam.—Jerusalem Consular Chronicle.

SENSE OR INSTINCT?—The power of judging of actual danger, and the free and easy boldness which result from it, are by no means uncommon. Many birds seem to have a most correct notion of a gun's range, and while scrupulously careful to keep beyond it, confine their care to this caution, though the most obvious resources would be to fly right away out of sight and hearing, which they do not choose to do. And they sometimes appear to make even an ostentatious use of their power, fairly putting their wits and cleverness in antagonism to that of man for the benefit of their fellows. We lately read an account, by a naturalist in Brazil of an expedition he made to one of the islands of the Amazon to shoot spoonbills, ibises and other of the magnificent raptorial birds which were most abundant there. His design was completely foiled, however, by a wretched little sand piper that preceded him, continually uttering his tell tale cry, which at once aroused all the birds within hearing. Throughout the day did this individual bird continue his self imposed duty of sentinel to others, effectually preventing the approach of the fowler to the game, and yet managing to keep out of the range of his gun.
