Instantly the doors on either side of the hall were thrown open, and out poured the officers and assistants with smiling faces. The organ grinder took in his audience at a glance. So he turned on a waltz and set the machine going again. In an instant the audience was fired up. Sheriff Ferris and Janitor Welsh struck into the giddy measures of the waltz, while lawyer McNulty, who happened to be present, grasped Linehan in his arms, and the two glided away into unconsciousness while the organ pealed out its dulcet strains. The effect was contagious. Deputy Sheriff Sals and Treasurer Harrison, called away like the young urger, followed. The recorder's office, with its feminine assistants, all yielded to the inspiring influences of the occasion, and soon the lady and gentlemen clerks were the merriest of the throng. The organ turned up anew and struck into a hornpipe. The entire company entered the circle. The windows rattled, the dust arose and flew out of the doors and windows toward the delighted sitters; the plastering trembled; the walls re-echoed the merry laughter of the dancers and the shouts of the organist to "stand down the hall." The treasurer's, auditor's, sheriff's, recorder's and clerk's and every other office was represented in the dance. It was a county dance.
