Butter and Poultry.

The production of butter and cheese as specialties began in the eastern part of New York about thirty years ago, and now, it is one of the leading industries of the State. In Pennsylvania the best counties are largely devoted to this industry; "the northern part of Ohio makes it a specialty, several counties of Michigan, all of northern Illinois, the best sections of Wisconsin, and portions of Iowa, give almost exclusive attention to making butter and cheese. California within ten years has changed from an importing to an exporting State in these articles. * * * With the exception of these States mentioned and a few counties in Vermont and New Jersey, the remainder of the United States buy more than they produce." The entire South is furnished from New York and the West. This is a state of things that should not exist. Our State is in every way favorable for this pursuit on an account of soil and climate. Allegheny especially is highly favored; Charlotteville presenting a fine market, equal to that of Richmond during most of the year. Yet a large portion of our citizens are compelled to send out of the county for their butter. Those who depend on the home market are occasionally annoyed by being unable frequently to purchase butter at all, and the most that is put upon the market is not sweet and fresh. There are few who really realize what a source of wealth this branch of industry might be to our State and county if properly attended to. The production of cheese in the United States is estimated at 350,000,000 lbs per annum
