THE FUTURE QUEEN OF SPAIN.—The Archduchess Maria Christine Desirée Heirliche Foliole Reine, of Austria, whom rumors mention as likely to be the second queen of Alfonso XII. of Spain, is the only daughter of the Archduke Charles Ferdinand of Austria, who died the 20th of November, 1874, by his marriage with the Archduchess Elizabeth, the widow of Archduke Ferdinand Charles Victor of Modena. She was born on the 21st of July, 1853, and is consequently in her twentieth year. The alliance does not seem to have been seriously entertained at Madrid until the condition of the Infanta Maria Christina had been pronounced hopeless, but from more than one point of view it must be considered a far more suitable match for the king than one with his deceased wife's sister. The Austrian Princess is a few months younger than the king, whereas the Ducesse Montepesier's second daughter was more than five years his senior, having been born on the 29th of October 1852. Her death has now left the Montepesier family without a marriageable daughter, and all the skill and sagacity of Louis Philippe to bring about his son's union with the Infanta Louisa has ended in disappointment.—Fall M.
