REGATTA MATTERS.

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, 1879. VIRGINIA. **WIRKREX** a 13th class boat filed in the District Court of the United States of America for the Eastern District of Virginia, on the 25th day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, by Josiah Ellis, Agent, John O.
