VIRGINIA MIDLAND R. R.
FOR SALE AT PUBLIC AUCTION.

By virtue of and in obedience to a decree ren-
dered by the Circuit Court for the city of Alex-
andria in the chancery cause of John C. Graham
vs. the Washington City, Virginia Midland and
Great Southern Rail Road Company and others
on the 13th day of February, 1880, I shall,
in front of the Market Building in the Royal
street, in the city of Alexandria, in the State of
Virginia, at twelve (12) o'clock m., on THURSDAY,
the 13th day of May, 1880, sell at public
auction to the highest bidder the following de-
scribed property:

The entire line of railroad known as the Wash-
ington City, Virginia Midland and Great South-
ern Rail Road, lying between the city of Alex-
andria and the city of Danville, and from the
town of Manassas, in the county of Prince Wil-
liam, on the storced main line, to the town of
Harrisonburg, in the county of Rockingham,
together with all the trackage thereof as they
now exist, with the appurtenances and equip-
ment, rights, privileges, franchises, property,
real and personal, and works to the said railroad
and branches respectively belonging, or in any-
wise appertaining, including the roadway and
tracks, rails and roadbed, side tracks, bridges,
viaducts, trestles, fences, stations, depots, ma-
chines, docks and wharves, sand and gravel pits
and deposits of materials and all other things be-
longing to, or used, or designed to be used, for or
in connection with the said railroad or branch
railroads respectively, together with all locomo-
tives and tenders, freight and passenger cars,
