FASTEST MAIL TIME ON RECORD.—The New York papers give an interesting story of a fast mail from Australia to England. On Wednesday last Postmaster James, of New York learned that the Pacific Mail steamer City of Sydney, which left Sydney September 9, had reached San Francisco October 6, two days ahead of time. It was just two hours too late to catch the mail train of that day and a delay of twenty-four hours was unavoidable. The schedule time from San Francisco would bring this important mail to the city two hours too late to catch the first departing British steamer, Mr. James went to the United States Pacific Mail and ascertained the facts to Sydney, and asked if a special could not be put on to catch the regular mail train of the day before. S. H. H. Clark, general manager of the Union Pacific at Omaha, and A. N. Towne, general superintendent at Omaha, replied in the affirmative, but added, "we shall have to run a special a thousand miles and it will cost a thousand dollars." "I don't care what it cost," replied Mr. Dillor; "do it." The telegraph was put in requisition and it was done. The regular mail train was overtaken at Omaha, the Australian mail car was attached, and on Monday night at 9.18 it was started in New York, and went out yesterday by the Arizona to England. It will make the schedule time the trip from Sydney will have been made in the shortest time on record, about forty days.
