



### Praise Children.

There is an old superstition that praise is too good a thing to be given to the children; that it is too rich for their mortal and mortal digestion. Some parents are so afraid that a child will grow proud that they never praise him, and this course is often disastrous. It is apt to produce either too much self-assertion—for self-assertion is a legitimate outgrowth of the withholding of commendation to which one is entitled—or to engender a self-distrust, or melancholy hopelessness of disposition. Praise is sunshine to a child, and there is no child that does not need it. It is the high reward of one's struggle to do right. Thomas Hughes says: "But you can never eat a man's bread out of him without praise. Many a sweetly child, we believe, dies of hunger for kind commendation. Many a child starving for the praise that a parent should give, runs off eagerly after the degrading flattery of others. To withhold praise where it is due is to dishearten, and, in the case of a child, such a course often leaves a stinging sense of injustice. Motives of commendation as well as regard for the future of the child should induce the parent to give praise to a child who deserves it. Of course there is a difference in the commendation of children. Some cannot bear so much praise as others, and some need a great deal. It should never be indiscriminate. We remember a wonderful woman who taught school in one village until she had educated a part of three generations. She was one of the most successful of teachers, but her success lay in her gift of praising with discrimination. A bad boy, who was a good scholar, got praise for his brilliancy, and his behavior, and so was won to a better life. And we recall a good girl, who had no gift of learning rapidly, but who was saved from utter despair by the praise she got for her untiring industry. Into the discouraged hearts of the children the praise of the teacher came like sunlight. And the virtue, like other fruits, can only ripen in the sunshine.—Edward Eggleston.

### SOCIAL LIFE OF MONKEYS.

Although each family lives separate, it appears to be on social terms with the other families of the tribe, and when they remove their habitations all travel together in large bands. Live us suppose that the little orphan previously mentioned, now grown up and become one of the leaders of the tribe had taken unto himself a wife from among the most attractive females of his species. Let us suppose that they are a happy couple, living in the social freedom of their native wood, and knowing nothing of the doings of the outer world, who suddenly a party of travelers appear upon the scene, and a blessed dispatch the young bride. The sequel, to quote Forbes in his "Oriental Memoirs," was as follows: "On a shooting party one of my friends killed a female monkey, and carried it to his tent, which was soon surrounded by forty of the tribe, who made a great noise, and in a menacing posture advanced toward it. On his presenting his fowling piece, chattering and creaking in a furious manner. He at length came close to the tent door, and finding that his threats were of no avail, began a lamentable moaning, and by every expression of grief and supplication seemed to beg the body of the deceased. On this it was given to him. He took it up to his arms, eagerly pressed it to his bosom, and carried it off to a sort of triumph to his evening occupation. The artless behavior of this poor animal wrought so powerfully on the sportsmen that they resolved never more to kill a single one of the monkey tribe." According to their custom of carrying away their dead and wounded, it may be presumed that our hero bore off his murdered bride and buried her, in accordance with the habits of his tribe, beneath a tuft of leaves. These creatures, as we know, feel the most intense and overpowering sorrow for their deceased, and something closely approaching to human intelligence mingles with their sense of the ravages of death.




