Hartmann, the Nihilist. Leo Hartmann, the famous Russian nihilist, whose arrival in New York was noted in yesterday's Gazette, was interviewed by a newspaper reporter. The hero of a thousand narrow escapes, and, if report be true, the originator of many desperate and deadly plots against the Mitrovi Empire, does not look like a nihilist. That is to say, he does not present the appearance of a crime stained apostle of assassination. His figure is rather slight. He is below the middle height. His head is a bumpy shaped, though perhaps the forehead may be receding. His eyes are bright, and when he speaks he flashes them about in all directions, never letting them remain fixed for any length of time on any object. He wears a short beard.

Upon being asked he intended making America his future home, Hartmann replied: "No, I have no such intention. As soon as our cause will permit, I am fully prepared to return to Russia together with my comrades. I mean to continue to the bitter end the struggle against despotism. We are supplied with ample means to fill the waterfalls of Russian spies and to pass and repass the frontier without being known. Even in Russia itself we are comparatively safe, for all classes of the population are on our side and ready to co-operate with us all pursuit. To show you how easy it is for one of our party to elude detection I do mind telling you that two weeks ago, after
