ENTIRE LINE OF THE WASHINGTON & OHIO  
RAILROAD,  
including that partly and that wholly constructed,  
and also all singular and the works and prop-

franchises of said Washington and Ohio Railroad  
Company.

The said property consists of a constructed line  
of railway in active operation from the city of Alex-  
andria, Va., westward through the counties of  
Alexandria, Fairfax and Loudoun to Round Hill  
station, in Loudoun county, a distance of 51 1/2

## DEFERRED LOCAL ITEMS.

The building of the new wharf around the  
Pioneer Mills has been completed.  
Count Mikiewicz having last Summer  
run Lower Cedar Point in a manner that  
almost bankrupted his Baltimore employ-  
ers, will this year try his luck at White  
Point, on the Potomac.

The sloop Music, loaded with fish,  
which was struck by a squall on Wed-  
nesday morning off the Half Way Tree and  
capsized and sunk, has been raised and  
towed to Washington.

The large steam tug S. W. French, which  
came around here from Baltimore at the  
opening of the season to run fish from the  
lower Potomac to this city and Washington,  
has quit the business and will return home.  
Not enough money in the cause.

The shipyard presents a lively scene. A  
large number of men are at work on the  
new schooner being built there, which is  
almost ready for planking, and other work  
is going on. The work of laying a railroad  
track from Wolfe street to the yard has  
been commenced.

The steam tug James Jackson, jr., belong-  
ing to Captain Samuel English, which has  
been undergoing repairs for the past month,  
left here Thursday for the first time to go  
down the river. When opposite Fort Foote  
the little steamer broke down and had to be  
towed back to the city by the steam tug  
Keystone.

Governor Cameron has offered a reward  
of \$250 for the arrest of C. V. Carnale, the  
wife poisoner of Fauquier county. The  
police authorities of this city say that when  
a reward is offered by Virginia officials for  
the arrest of a criminal no circular giving a  
description of the party wanted is ever sent  
out, or at least none ever reaches police head-  
quarters here. They think that if a descrip-  
tive circular is issued it certainly ought to  
be sent here, for nearly all criminals making  
their way out of the State pass through this  
city. Captain Webster is daily in receipt  
of postal cards and circulars from cities out-  
side of the State giving descriptions of  
parties wanted for crimes committed.

## The Anti-Duelling Bill.

The following bill has passed both Houses  
of the Legislature:  
Be it enacted &c., That every person elec-  
ted or appointed to any post or office under  
the laws of this Commonwealth, including  
members of the General Assembly, shall be-  
fore he acts in such office, in addition to the  
oaths now prescribed by law, take the fol-  
lowing oath:

I swear (or affirm) that I have not since  
the 1st day of May, 1882, fought in a duel,  
the issue of which was, or probably might  
have been, the death of either party; nor  
have I been knowingly the bearer of any  
challenge or acceptance to fight a duel actu-  
ally fought; nor have I been otherwise en-  
gaged or concerned, directly or indirectly,  
in a duel actually fought since said time;  
nor will I, during my continuance in office,  
be so engaged, directly or indirectly, so  
help me God.

That should be exempted from the opera-  
tion of this act the case of a person residing  
in another State who is appointed a commis-  
sioner by the Governor and such other cases  
as the law may specially direct.

2. Every person holding an office or post  
under the laws of this Commonwealth who  
shall hereafter fight a duel or send or accept  
a challenge to fight a duel, or who shall  
knowingly be the bearer of a challenge or  
acceptance to fight a duel, shall forfeit his  
said post or office, and be thereafter disqual-  
ified from holding a post or office under the  
laws thereof; and this act shall be construed  
to apply to members of the General Assem-  
bly of Virginia.

These drawings occur monthly (Sundays ex-  
cepted) under provisions of an Act of the General  
Assembly of Kentucky.

The United States Circuit Court on March 31  
rendered the following decision:
