It is adjudged, ordered and decreed that this case be referred to a Master Commissioner of this Court to ascertain and report to the next term of this Court—

1st. The character and value of the personal estate of Geo. W. Harding, deceased, which came into the hands of Anthony Harding, his administrator, and what disposition has been made of the same.

2d. The amount of the debts due and owing by the estate of the said Geo. W. Harding, and what proportion of the same have been paid by his administrator.

3d. The value of all real estate of which the said Geo. W. Harding died seized and possessed; its location and the quality thereof.

4th. Whether or not the personal assets of the estate of the said Geo. W. Harding will be sufficient to pay off and discharge the debts of the said estate, and if not, the amount of the deficiency.

5th.
