THE OYSTER DREDGERS.—Representative Findlay on Thursday presented in the House of Representatives a petition for the relief of oyster dredgers in the Chesapeake bay and its tributaries. The petition calls the attention of Congress to a system of slavery existing on vessels engaged in oyster dredging in the waters of the Chesapeake bay, which, in its brutality, oppression and horrible treatment, has rarely been equaled in history.
