Exploiting a Terrible Crime.

Protestant Valentine was hanged at 1:45

yesterday afternoon at Augusta, Ga., for the

murder of William Vales, watchman at the

station of the Augusta and Somerville Rail-

road. Valentine was executed in the pres-

ence of several hundred persons. There

were several thousand people outside. Val-

entine made a rambling talk, confessed the

crime, said he was ready to die, and warned

all to beware of his fate; that he had ex-

perienced great contrition, had made peace

with God, and expected to go to heaven.

His death was by strangulation. The body

was let down in fifteen minutes, and was

turned over to his relatives for burial at

Trenton, S. C. The crime for which Valen-

tine was hanged was cold blooded and pre-

meditated. His victim was an old man

named Vales, who was employed as a night

watchman at the station of the street rail-

way company of Augusta. On the morning

of the 12th of September, 1884, the dead

body of the old watchman was found in the

office of the superintendent so disfigured by

blows upon the head and the action of fire

that the features were not recognizable.

Nearly all the clothing was burned from

the body, and the flesh had in many places

peeled from the limbs. It was evident that

the murderer had endeavored to hide his

crime by setting fire to the building, in the

hope that it might appear that an accidental

fire had occurred, and that the watchman

had lost his life in the accident. The fire

burned out, however, after burning a

few holes in the floor and partially consum-

ing the remains of the old man. The body

had been saturated with coal oil, and the

match applied before life was extinct, and

the flow of blood had been partially in-
