The Lucknow papers report an awful tragedy which has taken place in the Leicestershire regiment. Some privates in a detachment stationed at Rahnkhet owed a grudge against the sergeant of their company, and vowed vengeance, so they actually dealt round a pack of cards, having agreed that the man to whom the ace of spades was dealt was to "do" the offender. The card fell to a young private, who, when the sergeant entered the place where they were assembled, at once took up his rifle and shot him dead. The murderer has been sentenced to death, but Sir Frederick Roberts had not confirmed the sentence when the mail left.

Some strange signs were witnessed at Carpentras, in the department of the Vaucluse, during the execution of a man named Ginoux, who had violated and murdered a little girl of 8 years some months ago. Ginoux thought he would be reprieved at the last moment. When his death warrant was read to him he appeared calm. As soon as the knife had severed his head from his body, the people rushed to the guillotine, and sprinkled their children with the murderer's blood. This horrible proceeding is believed in the south of France to be efficacious in preventing children from becoming murderers themselves.

THE STRIKERS STRUCK.—There is again bustle along the river fronts in New York, and the old-time scenes of activity have returned. Steamers are leaving at their advertised time, and the jam of freight on the railroad piers no longer exists. The strikers admit there are too many men looking for work for the unions to fight the companies. The Commercial Advertiser estimates that the strike has cost the men \$211,186 in loss of wages. Besides, it says some 3,000 laborers have been brought to New York from other cities who will probably stay, now that they have secured steady places, and then adds: "The strikers have therefore succeeded in adding 3,000 to the poor laborers of New York, and have thus decreased their own chances for getting employment hereafter. Besides the wages they have lost and the suffering they have brought on themselves and their families, these are the only tangible results the strikers have gained."
