POISONED BY CANDY.—Last June Rev. W. T. Howland, who for thirteen years had been a missionary in India, returned to Aurburndale, Mass., owing to frequent attacks of pneumonia suffered by Mrs. Howland. While her husband was in Montreal recently she was taken sick and Mr. Howland was summoned to return. He brought with him a quantity of candy, of which both he and his wife partook. Two days afterward Mrs. Howland died, and within forty-two hours of her decease Mr. Howland was dead. The physicians pronounce the disease gastro-hepatitis, with a trace of blood poisoning. The cause of their demise is attributed to the candy.

STRIKE ENDED.—The strike of the printers in Milwaukee is at an end, the typographical union having allowed its members to procure work wherever they can get it. The newspaper offices are fully manned by strange men, however, and few of the strikers will be able to obtain work. The blow is a heavy one to the union, and it is doubtful if it can hold together under the strain.

CHARGED WITH HERESY.—A formal charge of heresy has been made against Prof. J. E. Russell, professor of Biblical theology at Yale College, by Rev. A. E. Dunn, who claims that Russell's teachings are heretical, and that he denies the divinity of Christ. The Yale faculty think the charges are made to give Dunn a little notoriety.
