AN EXCITING EPISODE—Congressman John M. Glover and Judge Henry D. Laughlin, one of the most prominent attorneys in St. Louis, were the central figures in a little sensation yesterday that threatens serious consequences. R. D. Lancaster, surveyor of the port, is suing Glover for \$100,000 for alleged libel. Glover is taking depositions to show Lancaster's character. The taking of depositions has been progressing several days and exciting personal episodes have enlivened the proceedings. Judge Laughlin is of the counsel for Lancaster. Glover objected to Laughlin's way of handling a witness and Laughlin resented the conduct and words of the Congressman. Hot words ensued and both men sprang to their feet. The referee before whom the case is proceeding got between them and prevented a fight. At the close of the day's session Glover said he had used harsh language and was willing to withdraw the epithets he had applied to Laughlin if the latter would do the same. "I am willing to go half way," he said. "I'll have no half-way business," said Laughlin. "You are the aggressor, and must apologize fully." "I'll see you further," said Glover. "You will see me further," said Laughlin, "and hear from me." It is thought by those who know both men that Laughlin, who is known to be a man of nerve, and an expert with the pistol, will compel Glover to make a full apology or meet him in mortal combat.
