A CUTTING AFFAIR.—Last Saturday night about half-past nine o'clock a dispute arose between Sol. Harris, James Grimes, Wm. H. Fisher and James Parks, growing out of politics in the county, when Jas. Grimes cut Sol. Harris in the stomach with a knife, inflicting a dangerous wound about six inches in length. The cutting took place on Arlington turnpike, a little above the brick yards, near Mr. McLean's store. Half an hour later Justice J. D. Nauck arrived on the scene on his way home from Washington and immediately caused Constable George Ransom to arrest James Grimes, Parks and Fisher, when Grimes stated that he had done the cutting. Justice Nauck committed him to jail for further examination, and Parks and Fisher were recognized for their appearance in the sum of \$100 each. The wounded man was put into a wagon and taken to the Emergency Hospital, in Washington, where he was attended by Dr. J. Ford Thompson. To-day Mr. S. G. Brent, counsel for Grimes, sued out a writ of Habeas corpus to have the prisoner taken before the jury Wednesday and released on bail.

INTERESTING CEREMONY.—One of the prettiest social events of the season was the christening yesterday of the little son of Mr. and Mrs. Herwig—formerly Miss Wheat, of Alexandria. The rite was performed at St. Paul's church, Rev. Dr. Norton, officiating; after which the guests were most delightfully entertained at the residence of Mrs. Wheat, on Prince street. The young hero of the day, a bonny, yellow-haired laddie, whose tiny cards of invitation bore the name of Leopold Ludwig Heinrich Herwig, was the recipient of some lovely gifts, and had his health drunk many times from a royal bowl of champagne punch. Among some of the strangers present were, Mr. Heaton, the artist; Miss Rosecrans; Mr. Baird, of the navy; and Mrs. Baird; Mr. and Mrs. Ellette; Mrs. Tilton; Mrs. Trimble; Misses Blunt, Campbell, Trimble; Capt. Cralle, and others, including a number from this place. Mr. Herwig has been ordered to China, and accompanied by Mrs. Herwig and Master Heinrich, will sail for Yokohama the last of this month, to be absent three years.

KILLED BY LIGHTNING.—During a hail storm last Friday, near Stafford Store, in Stafford county, lightning struck the residence of Mr. Wm. Parsons, and killed three of his children, aged from 9 to 16 years, and Mr. Luther Wright, of Independent Hill, Prince William county, who had left home for the purpose of purchasing a yoke of cattle, and stopped at Mr. Parsons' place for shelter. The lightning burst the chimney and killed the children mentioned, one of whom was holding a young child in her arms. The younger child was not hurt. Mr. Wright, who was standing in the door watching his horse, was struck on the head, the bolt running to his feet and tearing the soles from his boots. Mr. Wright at the time had \$75 in his pocket, which was taken, it is said, by some one who had come in to take care of the dead. Mr. Wright leaves a wife and child. The funeral was conducted by Ledman & Cidwill, undertakers, Occoquan.

POLICE REPORT.—Last night was mild with rain till 2 o'clock. There were nine prisoners at the station house. The Mayor this morning disposed of the following cases: Howard Bryant, Richard Johnson and Moses Harris, colored, and Wm. Fisher, arrested by Lieut. Smith and officers Ticer and Bettice, for being drunk on the street, were fined \$1 each. Jeff. Williams and Jas. Clift, arrested by officers Brenner and Ticer for being drunk, were sent to jail for five days. G. G. Riley, arrested by officer Bettice, for being drunk and disorderly and for an assault on Capt. Wesley Davis, forfeited \$10 which he had left for his appearance. Littleton Hall, arrested by officer Ticer, for being drunk on the street, had his case continued. A young man arrested by officer Hayes for being drunk forfeited \$5 which he had left for his appearance.

CORPORATION COURT.—Judge N. B. Meade presiding.—Waters vs. Waters et al., decree directing sale of property and substituting E. M. Lawson as trustee in place of Thomas Waters. G. E. Entwistle vs. T. B. Entwistle et al.; decree of reference. A rule was issued against Paul C. Dorsey requiring him to show cause why he should not be fined for contempt of court for refusing to allow Ruth A. Robbins to examine the books and accounts of the Braddock House as ordered by previous decree of this court. A number of licenses to sell liquor for the month of May were granted. Court adjourned till to-morrow morning at 10 o'clock.

BE SCHEMED.—Count Mikowicz, well known in this county, has concluded the big scheme of his life. As a member of a syndicate of three persons the Count has induced the Chinese government to adopt the sole and exclusive use of a telephone that he represents as agent. The government pays an immense sum for the use of the instrument and forbids the use of any other telephone by private individuals in the territory. The Count invented the scheme of inventing the China government into his project, and, backed by two New York capitalists, it was successfully worked. The Count is an irrepressible individual. —Maryland Independent.

ROBBERY.—The store of Mr. Harry Kirk, on Union street, near King, was entered on Saturday night last, and robbed of a few dollars in change, which had been left in the money drawer, and a small quantity of tobacco. The thief gained an entrance to the store by scaling the back fence and piling boxes up to the second story window, which he opened. After getting the money and tobacco he left by one of the front doors, which soon afterwards was found open by officer Davis.

DEAD INFANT FOUND.—The dead body of a white male infant was found on the river shore between Wilkes and Gibbons streets, yesterday evening, by some little boys who were playing there. The body bore evidences of having been in the water for some time. It was taken to the station house but no inquest was held. This makes the third infant found in a similar manner in the past few months.

DROWNED.—Intelligence was received here to-day of the drowning in the Delaware river on the 26th ult., of Mr. George Southard, formerly of this city. He was a pilot on a schooner bound from Baltimore to Philadelphia, when the accident occurred, and at last accounts his body had not been recovered. Southard, who left here about ten years ago, had many friends living in this city.

DEAD FROM EXHAUSTION.—About ten miles yesterday morning an unknown man was discovered to be ill, was found near Cambridge run bridge, on the Virginia-Maryland highway, in a semi-conscious condition. He was brought to this city and taken to the Infirmary, where he sufficiently recovered to tell those around him that he was a German by birth and that his name was Henry Derrick. He said he had tramped from a point near Baltimore to this city and was on his way South, and that he had been without food for several days. The unfortunate man died about half past six o'clock in the evening, and should his body not be claimed the remains will be interred in the Infirmary lot to-morrow afternoon. The deceased seemed to have been a docile, gentlemanly person and of a genus above the average itinerant.

THE PRIMARY.—The democratic primary to select candidates for the various municipal offices to be chosen at the general election on the 26th instant, has been in progress all day and considerable interest taken in the result by the friends of the different candidates. The contest has been conducted in a friendly manner, and although at all of the voting places crowds of men have congregated, there has been no disorder. The voting being by ballot it will, of course, be impossible to tell who are the successful candidates till the tickets are canvassed. The vote at 4 o'clock was as follows: First ward, 230; Second ward, 207; Third ward, 411; Fourth ward, 238.

STORMS.—This vicinity was visited yesterday by a succession of thunder storms, which continued at intervals throughout the day. In the early morning the storm was quite a severe one, during which several buildings were struck by lightning, but none of them, however, were much damaged. The centre piece of the cornice on Sarepta Hall building was struck and a piece of it knocked off, and several bricks were torn from the residence of Mr. J. P. Clark, on Duke street. Several trees in Fairfax county, near this city, were also struck.

SALE OF THE ALEXANDRIA AND WASHINGTON RAILROAD.—It will be seen by the advertisement of Commissioner Pleasants, of the U. S. Circuit Court, that the Alexandria and Washington railroad will be sold in front of the Custom House, in this city, on the 9th of July next. A description of the property is given in the advertisement.

FISH.—Since Saturday's report about 60,000 herring and 1,500 shad have arrived at Fishtown. Herring sold at from \$2 to \$3 per thousand and shad at from \$8 to \$12 per hundred. Many fishermen say that the season is about at a close.

REGISTRATION.—The registration books of the city will be opened to-morrow (Tuesday) for the purpose of registering all new voters and to grant transfers to those who have removed from one ward to another since the last registration.

LOCAL BREVITIES.—The regular monthly meeting of the Order of Railroad Conductors was held yesterday at their hall in this city. The steamer City of Alexandria has been withdrawn from the ferry route to be repaired, and the steamer Arrowsmith has taken her place.

The Baltimore papers state that Mr. and Mrs. J. Southgate Yeaton have recently purchased one of the fine marble dwellings on Maryland avenue, in that city, built by P. Hanson Hiss & Co.

Intelligence was received here to-day of the sudden death in Westmoreland county of Rev. Dabney Wharton, a well-known Episcopal minister of that county.
