A QUANT OLD TOMBSTONE.—A correspondent of the Baltimore Sun writes from Stafford county, Va.: "Within a few miles of the Potomac river, nestled amongst the hills of Stafford county, stands a quaint, old church, built in the early colonial times of brick brought over from England. It is known as 'Old Aquia Church.' The Federal armies camped around it, and the hand of a ruthless soldiery not only was laid upon the venerable building, but also desecrated the graves of the dead which lie in the graveyard surrounding the church. Many of the tombstones are exceedingly old, but having been so abused and broken by the soldiers the names and dates cannot be deciphered. There is one, however, which attracted the writer's attention, and which is of interest to Marylanders, and to the Sewall family especially. The metal plate containing the name and date has been destroyed, but lettered underneath in the stone is the following inscription: 'She was the daughter of Lady Baltimore by Henry Sewall, esq., Secretary of Maryland. Her age, 35 years.' This lady, no doubt, married a Virginian, as in those days there was much visiting between the two shores; if not why were her remains not laid amongst her kindred folk in Maryland? The early history of Maryland most likely makes some mention of the children of Lady Baltimore by the above mentioned marriage. The Sewall family herein mentioned is probably the Sewall family of the present day."
