LOCAL BREVITIES.

The sun "fulled" to-day. Last night was a scorcher. The owners of a large number of dogs have so far failed to take out licenses.

The mercury in the thermometer registered 92 degrees in the shade to-day.

The new passenger station of the W. and O. R. R., at Leesburg, is rapidly nearing completion.

The Relief Hook and Ladder Co. to-day received a new ladder for the one which was recently broken.

A marriage license was issued in Washington yesterday to Edward Clark and Mary E. Williams, of Culpeper county.

H. C. Dodd, a highly respected resident of Falls Church, died last evening, after a very short illness, of typho-malaria.

It is said that grass growing in gutters and on the sidewalks can be speedily killed and removed by pouring hot water upon it.

Hereafter there will be no public ringing of the fire alarm bells in Washington and the use of bells upon horse-cars will also be prohibited.

A fox raided a flock of young turkeys belonging to Mr. Wallace George, near Leesburg, on Sunday night, and killed sixty-six out of seventy.

Mr. Julian Knight, of this city, who was in Washington yesterday, was within a short distance of Mr. J. C. Kennedy when he was killed by John Daily, and helped to arrest the latter.

The Warren German Club has organized for the season with thirty active members. The club has arranged for a german every Friday night until October and have engaged Weber to furnish the music.

A white tramp, who said he was from New York, was found on the railroad track near Bourboursville, Orange county, on Tuesday morning fatally injured. He was taken to Charlottesville where he died in a short time. It is thought he was struck by a passenger train on the Virginia Midland road.
