DIAMOND THIEF CAPTURED.—Detectives arrested George Faith yesterday morning as he stepped off the Desbrosses street ferry-boat at Jersey City. Faith, who is a noted burglar, is wanted for a burglary at Fairchild & Co's jewelry store, in Bridgeport, Ct., on July 17. The safe was broken open and \$15,000 worth of diamonds and jewelry stolen. He returned recently from a professional trip to Europe, which is said to have been very successful. He has already served three terms in different prisons. Faith was arraigned before Judge Stirling, and turned over to the Pinkerton detectives. Faith lived with his wife in the basement of a frame house in Jersey City. The premises were searched, and a startling array of burglar's tools were found, including jimnies, wedges, lock-picks, saws, sledges, braces, bits of all kinds, over 500 keys of various shapes, wax impressions of keys, and books containing cipher entries. Mrs. Faith had expensive diamond jewelry, which she claimed as her own, but they will be held to await identification by Fairchild & Co. In a rear woodshed the officers found about ten pounds of dynamite cartridges, and a lot of fuses and caps. Superintendent Banks, of the Pinkertons, says it is the finest assortment he ever saw. The collection will be taken to Bridgeport, to be used as evidence in Faith's trial.

HAND ORGANS.—A manufacturer of hand organs does business on the top floor of a dingy old house on Park Row, near Chatham square. "The price of an organ," said he, "depends upon its size and the number of tunes it plays. It ranges all the way from \$90 to \$500. Italians used to buy the most of them, but they seem now to be dropping out of the business and to have taken to the pickaxe and shovel. Lane and blind men are our best customers nowadays. We have quite a number of out-of-town orders from them. We are also shipping largely to the West Indies. Hand organs are very popular down there. In Havana troops of young girls go about the streets and dance to their accompaniment. Very few hand organs are imported into this country. The duty would be too heavy for the average organ grinder. The Italians do not pay rent for their instruments. They buy them outright and pay solid cash. It costs something to put a new tune in an organ.
