THE RICHMOND TERMINAL CONTEST.—Mr. J. L. Rice has written a letter to the New York Herald concerning the recent meeting of the stockholders of the Richmond Terminal Company, in which he says:

"The statement that my compromise was offered or suggested by myself or any of my associates is absolutely false. The statement that I asked for a guarantee of the payment of the dividend on the preferred stock is too absurd to require refutation. There was no person present who could give such guarantee had I even dreamed of demanding it. The statement that I asked for minority representation on the Terminal Board is a pure fiction. Our movement originated when we learned that the Terminal Board had borrowed the money to pay the January dividend on the preferred stock and the February interest on the collateral trust bonds. Immediately thereupon a large number of the stockholders, fearing that the petition of such a proceeding would force the company into bankruptcy and a receiver's hands, and knowing that the directors themselves had but a small interest in the stock, we organized for the purpose of self-protection. It was our avowed object to compel the present directors either to withdraw from the management of the property or to acquire a substantial interest in the stock. I am assured by one of the highest officers of the company that the present directors have increased their holdings to 175,000 shares."
