## The Skies in February.

The planet of the month that will attract  
the greatest attention is again Venus, as she  
shines even before the setting of the sun.  
She is rapidly approaching the earth and in-  
creasing in size and brilliancy. She will not  
set before 9:30 o'clock, and will be a most  
beautiful object in the western sky through-  
out the month. A very important event in  
her course is her reaching on February 18th  
the point of greatest distance from the sun,  
after which she will retrace her steps. After  
February 5 Saturn becomes an evening  
star, and he is in opposition with the sun  
and offers the best conditions for observa-  
tion on that day. He rises in the early  
evening, continuing visible almost until ear-  
ly dawn. He shines with a steady pale yel-  
low light that makes him easily distinguish-  
ed from his setting of small twinkling stars,  
as well as from Regulus, the bright star in  
the Sickle. Mercury passes the first portion  
of the month as evening star, and the latter  
half as one of the morning stars. He is  
visible to the naked eye in the western sky  
about three quarters of an hour after sun-  
set for the first week of the month, shin-  
ing with a light somewhat similar to that of  
Sirius, the brightest of the fixed stars. Mars,  
another of the evening stars, moves north-  
ward during the month, setting about three  
hours after the sun. In the constellation of  
Taurus is the distant Neptune, which is in  
quadrature with the sun on the 17th. Jupiter  
is the most conspicuous object in the  
morning sky, appearing between three and  
four hours ahead of the sun. His beaming  
light, far outshining all other stars in the  
heavens at that early hour, would render  
him a dangerous rival for Venus were he  
but an evening star. Uranus shares a small  
portion of the honor of his larger brother,  
and with a telescope he could be found in  
the constellation of Virgo.

## HOBSON'S CHOICE—Very few persons under-

stand the origin of the phrase "Hobson's  
choice." Thomas Hobson was born in 1544.  
He was for sixty years a carrier between  
London and Cambridge, conveying to and  
from the University, letters and packages,  
also passengers. In addition to his express  
business, he had a livery stable and let  
horses to the University students. He made  
it a rule that all the horses should have, ac-  
cording to their ability, a proper division of  
work and rest. They were taken out in  
regular order, as they stood, beginning with  
the one nearest the door. No choice was  
allowed, and if any man refused to take the  
animal assigned him he might go without  
any. That or none. Hence the phrase  
"Hobson's Choice." In the spring of 1630,  
the plague broke out in England. The col-  
leges of Cambridge were closed, and among  
the precautions taken by the authorities to  
avoid infection, Hobson was forbidden to go  
to London. He died in January, 1631, par-  
tly, it is said, from anxiety and fretting at  
his enforced leisure. Hobson was one of the  
wealthiest citizens of Cambridge, and did  
much for the benefit of the city, to which he  
left several legacies. His death called forth

Christ's College.

porters he has been stern, haughty, even  
overbearing and bullying. Toward foreign  
powers he has been mild, docile, timid,  
cheerfully turning the other cheek to the  
smiter. If his foreign policy had been his  
domestic policy, and his domestic policy his  
foreign policy, both might have been more  
successful. As it is, neither has been suc-  
cessful. He has maintained a bold and ag-  
gressive front against his own party, and a  
timorous front against foreign foes. There  
is no more curious record of statesman-  
ship standing on its head than Mr. Cleve-  
land has made for himself, and so far  
as he could, for the great American party of  
the United States.—N. Y. Sun.
