Mosby's Dream of Power.
[From the San Francisco Chronicle.]
The world has known few men who have had cast at their feet opportunities to become commanders of great armies, with possibilities in sight of forming empires and ruling over them, and fewer still who having possessed such tempting opportunities have had the moral courage to respond to the dictates of conscience and cast them away. Small as is the list of those who have done this, there is an American citizen who can claim the distinguished honor of being numbered among them.
The citizen referred to is the famous Confederate officer, Colonel John S. Mosby, whose deeds of valor are registered in the history of a hundred battles of the civil war. Firm as must have been the courage which swayed him in the many bloody campaigns he has seen, it was as nothing in comparison with the fortitude which he called to his aid when he refused an offer from Li Hung Chang, the Bismarck of China, to take command of the armies of that great empire in its war with France. The circumstance of Colonel Mosby's refusal to do the destinies of the Flowery Kingdom's army to the field during the conflict of over a decade ago, forms a hitherto unwritten page in the history of the Tonquin war, and goes to show how warm is the feeling in the hearts of Americans for the country which gave birth to Lafayette.

It was not without a great amount of difficulty that a *Chronicle* reporter succeeded in gaining Colonel Mosby's consent to an interview on the subject, but his scruples against allowing his name to appear were finally overcome, and the story of how he declined an opportunity to become the head of one of the greatest armies on earth is now for the first time given to the world. "Yes, it is true that I once declined an offer to take command of the Chinese army," said the old warrior as he settled back in his easy chair, "and this is how it happened."
"In the month of December, 1884, while I was Consul for the United States at Hongkong, war was raging in Tonquin between the republic of France and the empire of China. I remember I was standing at Pedal's wharf, at the Prage, one day, when a passenger came to me from the American house of Russell & Co., telling me that they wanted to see me on important business. Russell & Co. were at that time the confidential agents of Li Hung Chang, Viceroy of China. Never dreaming for what purpose I was summoned, I proceeded immediately to their office, and was handed a translation of a cipher dispatch of which this is a copy."
Colonel Mosby here handed the reporter the following copy of a telegram which was sent to Russell & Co. at Hongkong, by Wheeler, agent of the Viceroy at Shanghai:

Sound Consul Mosby if he would enter Chinese Government service against France. Could he go or send to the United States and engage several hundred officers and men of good fighting record for our war? Get them out quietly and form foreign force, cavalry or infantry. Command them himself or get first-class fighting General of war experience to command. He will know many good Southern men. Regular army officers cannot well come. Get his views of what may be done, and whether good work may be expected from such a force. Enjoin secrecy.
"You may well believe that I was stunned by the proposition," continued Colonel Mosby. "Although pressed to do so, I would not give an immediate answer, but told them I would consider the proposition and give them my ultimatum next day. Then I went home and slept on the offer."
"It was a fearful temptation. Cleveland had just been elected President, a fact which indicated my early recall to this country. Visions of barbaric riches, splendor and glory disturbed my slumbers, and I dreamed of playing the roles in China assumed by Hastings and Clive, in India. Grand imaginings of forming a new empire on the ruins of the old one floated airy through my excited brain, and in my delirium I dreamed that after defeating the French I might overthrow the Tartar dynasty at Peking and raise myself to the exalted position of Dictator of China."
"That great power over the destinies of men, ambition, urged me to accept the offer, but the still, small voice of conscience told me to reject it. I never had any respect for mere military adventurers. I could not be a soldier of fortune. I could not fight for gold. It is true that I had been a soldier in a great war and had gathered some of the Olympic dust in that grand struggle, but then I was not prompted by any feeling of self-elevation. I was sustained by a strong conviction of duty. I do not believe that Stonewall Jackson, who will rank with Hannibal and Napoleon as one of the great captains of the age, would have made any reputation fighting for a foreign people and a cause which he could never think was right. Then there is a traditional tie of sympathy between Virginians and the people of France which forbade me drawing my sword against that country."
"Then I had another reason for declining to raise my arm on the side of an Asiatic nation against Europeans. You may call it selfish if you like, but I loved the record I had made so much that I did not care to cast a blemish on it by affixing to my name the dubious title of adventurer. There is a certain amount of odium always attached to such a reputation. You remember Byron's description of Alp, the Christian renegade, leading an Asiatic horde at the siege of Corinth:
He felt how faint and feebly dim
The fame that could accrue to him,
Who cheered the band and waved the sword,
A traitor in a turbaned horde.
