Deferred Items.

A dispatch from Washington says: "The contest between Mr. Mills and Mr. Randall has probably settled the question of leadership of the minority in the Fifty-first Congress. Mr. Carlisle will of course receive the complimentary vote of the democratic caucus for Speaker, and he will probably be assigned to the ways and means committee. His knowledge of parliamentary practice completely overshadowed Mr. Randall during the past week, as was shown by his shrewd management of affairs in keeping matters of the highest privilege continually before the House, thus completely blocking the game the Randall republican combination attempted to play. No dilatory motions were resorted to, and there was a constant stream of legitimate business to keep the House occupied."

On last Friday Samuel Hodge, who is not less than 75 years old and twice a widower, living about twelve miles from Rockingham, N. C., induced Annie J. Norton, 12 years old, daughter of a respectable farmer, to steal away from her parents and go with him to town, he promising to buy her something pretty when in Rockingham. He left the child in a store and went to the register of deeds and by false representation procured a marriage license and by threats forced the young girl to marry him. As the couple were leaving town the girl began to cry and told her story to some young men who took her in charge and sent her home. The old man was chased into the woods. The girl's relatives are very indignant and swear vengeance against Hodge.

Loudoun and Fauquier fox hunters had a notable meet near The Plains, Va., Thursday. Over one hundred hunters and a pack of forty had a splendid run over a country entirely blue grass turf. Two foxes were bounced on Edward Holden's farm. The pack divided, one batch of dogs denning the fox on China's Plain, near Middleburg, the other denning their fox way up in Goose creek. The country is a fine one for viewing the case, and the hill tops in every direction were occupied by the citizens in groups intensely interested. Such noted dogs as Leader, Music, Racket, Red Stocking were in the lead. One of the foxes was smoked out of his den and killed.

At the Fifth Avenue Hotel in New York on Saturday night a very enthusiastic meeting was held in aid of the National Confederate Soldiers' Home in Austin, Texas. It was decided that all moneys from New York should be sent to Chauncey M. Depew. The money subscribed in other cities shall be taken care of by the local newspapers, which will forward it to Mr. Depew. The German singing societies have offered their services to the committee. A great public meeting in aid of the home will soon be held, the committee having money enough in hand to bear expenses.

General Lord Wolsley was the principal speaker at the dinner given by the Volunteer Medical Staff in London on Saturday. In the course of his speech, Lord Wolsley declared that if England should ever be invaded by a foreign foe the issue would be decided within a fortnight. The volunteer forces, he believed, would only require supplies wherewith to support life for fourteen days, and the invaders would be driven from England's shores.

Although William A. Thomas, who died January 4th, left an estate valued at a quarter of a million dollars, it is doubtful whether the heirs at law—all second cousins—Or Bettie Lewis, the colored claimant, will get much out of it. Thomas left no will, and a lively litigation is in progress over the estate in Richmond, Va.

Count Eugene De Minkiewicz entered security in Philadelphia on Saturday in his suit against Wharton Barker growing out of the Chinese concessions.

The three mile boat race between Gaudaur and O'Connor, at San Francisco on Saturday was won by the latter in 19 minutes and 45 seconds.
