A Ghastly Craft.

It was mentioned in the GAZETTE yesterday that the steamer Colorado, which arrived at New York Sunday, had sighted a raft at sea with two dead bodies upon it. From the time the Colorado left Galveston until 11 on Saturday morning her voyage had been uneventful. At that hour when 180 miles south of New York, the man on watch saw an object bobbing up and down on the waves about a mile away. There was a heavy sea on. One moment the thing could be seen on the crest of a wave, and again it disappeared in the trough. He could not make out what it was. When the steamer got nearer to the object it was found to be a life raft, such as is used by steamers. On it lay two men with their faces downward. A boat was lowered and rowed out to the raft, when both the men were found to be dead, their bodies being stiff as if frozen. Their faces were bloated and blue from exposure, so as to be hardly recognizable. One was tall and well built; he had dark kinky hair, which made some of the crew think he might have been a light colored negro. He wore a fine blue flannel shirt, two pairs of trousers, and a double-breasted coat. In his pockets were some pieces of hard tack. There were no signs of violence about him, nor did his features wear the pined expression that accompanies death by starvation. A rough cloth cap lay under his forehead. He lay in the middle of the raft, with one hand over the life lines and the other stretched out toward his companion. The fingers of each hand were drawn up, as though they had been clinging tightly to something. The other man was smaller, with a smooth dark face and long black hair. It was the common verdict that he had been a freeman. The fingers of both men were stained with nicotine from cigarette smoking. The life raft was of the smallest size made, and the only mark by which it could be identified was a small steel plate which was fastened to it and which was inscribed, "Captain Jonathan Cone, builder, Wilmington, Del." The raft had sunk considerably on one side, making it lopsided. On the high side lay the small man with his feet dangling in the water. His fingers were clenched over the life lines and the tide had been partly knocked off the raft and had been making desperate attempts to get back to where his companion lay. One hand of the latter was stretched toward him, and it looked as if the tall man had been engaged in assisting his companion when death overtook them both. A card bearing the name of a grocer in Havre was found in the pockets of the taller man. No mark by which either could be identified having been found, grate bars were fastened to the bodies and they were sunk into the sea. The Colorado then proceeded, a sharp lookout being kept for boats. None was seen, but for twenty miles the ship's track was strewn with wreckage. A part of an extension table, a lounge, bottom-side up, six cabin doors, a piece of a deck house, and a lot of heavy timbers were noticed. The timbers had evidently been broken by some strong shock, as their edges were jagged. The opinion was expressed that the two men belonged on some steamer and that the steamer was wrecked by collision. Only steamers carry such life rafts, and only on steamers do they have extension tables and inside cabin doors. It is probable that there were half a dozen men at least on the life raft when she was launched, and they were probably washed off or frozen so that they dropped off one by one. It is evident that the men had been prepared for something of the sort, as the taller one had on two pairs of trousers and had stuffed some hard tack in his pockets. They had evidently died from exposure and had not been dead long when discovered. It is believed that the lost ship to which the raft belonged was the Conserva, the Haytian gunboat that left New York for Samana last Tuesday, to engage in the civil war there.
