WHY FARMING DOES NOT PAY.—The
Philadelphia Times, in an editorial on the
depreciation of land values, truthfully re-
marks as follows: "The farming industry,
the greatest of all our industries, is now
perishing slowly but surely from the con-
tinuation of war taxes maintained nearly a
quarter of a century after peace, and when
the public treasury has been overflown
with surplus millions for years. It is a tax-
ation, and taxation only, that is depreciating
the value of our farms and lessening the re-
ward of agricultural labor from year to year.
The farmer is taxed needlessly, taxed for
almost everything he and his family con-
sume. If he scans his dress from hat to
boots, and from underclothing to overcoat,
he is taxed for everything he wears, and his
wife and daughters are like living monu-
ments of needless taxation. His house is
taxed from cellar to garret; his barn is
taxed from foundation stone to roof-shingle;
his implements are taxed from hoe to
threshing; his furniture is taxed from dust-
pan to bed; from carpet to curtain; from
the light of window to the darkness of closet;
from bible to newspaper; from salt to table,
and the only protection offered him is ver-
y little mockery. In short, the farmer has be-
come the man who works and pays, while
combines under excessive tax laws strip
him of his values and doom him to servitude
and poverty."

MURDEROUS CHURCH WAR.—Startling
revelations in connection with the burning
of the Russian church at San Francisco, Cal.,
the other day are coming in. Late on
Thursday night B. M. Gopschiritch, a mem-
ber of the church, who has been fearless
enough to assert that he believed the fire was
the work of a faction of fiends who were
anxious to destroy the records of their pilfering
of the past and the roster of illegitimate
children born to certain Russian and
Greek families in San Francisco, was set
upon by five men, one of whom struck him
down with a heavy iron bar, cutting a deep
gash in his chin and nearly breaking his

left to fire a shot from his revolver at them
while on the ground, and the would be as-
sassin retired. The scandal dated back ten
years. Bishop Kliedeovonsky, who attempted

church has been split up into two or more
factions, and it is charged that thousands of
dollars received from Alaska and proceeds
from property in the hands of church offi-
cials have been squandered.
