A SAD COMING HOME.—Shortly before that terrible flood, which almost wiped Johnston out of existence, Emil Etioine left Cambria City for his native town of Creonville, not far from Strasburg, in Albacore, to receive a comfortable fortune, which he had inherited from a relative. Etioine had been working as a puddler in the Cambria Iron Works for about two years previous to his departure for the Continent. He left a family consisting of a wife and five children behind him, happy in the thought that in a few months the head of the household would return with sufficient means to support them, if not in luxury, at least very comfortably, without further hard work of any kind. After some trouble Etioine won the lawsuit necessary to get the fortune, and started for home with about \$20,000. He intended to go into some business in Johnston. He reached Pittsburgh recently, in the forenoon, and boarded the Johnston accommodation at 1:30 p. m., which took him to the place where he had left those dearer than all the money in the world. When he got off at Johnston he was dazed, and thought he had struck the wrong station. He was looking around him in a puzzled way, when a man approached him and said: "I guess you are a stranger here, or have been in Johnston before the flood. It's quite changed now. I wouldn't have known myself if I had been away for six months." "As the man spoke," says Etioine, "I felt as if some one had pierced my heart with a sharp knife, and I fainted dead away." When he regained consciousness he made search for his family, but they were among the lot of the flood, and to-day the poor man was here on his way back to Albacore, where he says he will live the rest of his days in solitude and sadness.—Cincinnati Commercial.

A MULE BEATEN.—An interesting and singular battle took place one day last week in the Illinois Central yards between a fierce, large black horse and a mule, the two having been on exceptionally good terms with one another up to a few moments previous to the conflict. Suddenly the mule made a dash at the horse with his teeth, and, whirling about, planted both feet against the horse's body, with a resonant thud which could be heard throughout the yards. Then the battle began in earnest. The horse promptly reared the kicks by rounding to and returning them with rapid precision, both animals equalling with rage, biting and kicking one another until the blood flowed in rivulets from every portion of their bodies, the fight lasting an hour without intermission. The yard contained many horses and mules who appeared much excited during the row, heading and trembling in one corner and exhibiting every evidence of fear. The yardmen who witnessed the singular affair used every effort to part the crazy beasts, but without success, indeed running much personal risk in their efforts. Copious application of cold water with the hose and a liberal use of clubs were entirely unavailing, the fight raging until the mule ignominiously fled, bleeding from the severe punishment. Both animals are badly used up, being hardly able to walk, the mule faring worst.—St. Louis Globe Democrat.
