Letter from Fauquier.
(Correspondence of the Alexandria Gazette.)
ORLEAN, Va., Jan. 25.—Mr. John W.
Wright, aged about 60, passed peacefully
and happily away on Wednesday last from
single blessedness into matrimonial bliss, af-
ter a very welcome attack of the "grip,"
by Miss Loretta Orison, one of Loudoun's
famous daughters, aged 25. Loudoun is
made poorer, but Fauquier richer by this
exchange of homes. A brilliant reception
was held at Forest Grove, the hospitable
home of Mr. Wright, on Thursday evening,
under the supervision of Mrs. Wm. Baker,
Miss Jane Maddux and Miss Maggie Spei-
der, of Marshall, and the entertainment was
perfect to all its details. The rooms were
tastefully decorated and the bountifully for-
nished tables were loaded down with every
thing to tempt the appetite of the most
fastidious epicure—roast turkey, old Virginia
cured hams, oysters, etc., tropical fruits,
&c., &c. Among the large number of guests
were Mr. George W. Davis and family; Col.
McKee Jones, Dr. Hansbrough, Rev. Mr.
Joyce, sr., Rev. Mr. Joyce, jr., Rev. Mr.
Walters, Rev. J. M. Athey and family, Mrs.
Triplett, Mrs. Holland, Miss Grace Parr,
Mr. Will Lewis, Mr. W. S. Ivy, Mr. Ben.
Skinner, Mr. Wm. Baker and others.

Mr. L. L. Anderson, who kept the second
best 4th class postoffice in the State, and
whom every body liked, has been removed,
and the postoffice given to a man who voted
for Mahone and Mahoneism in the last
gubernatorial election. Said postmaster
was endorsed by the chairman of the republi-
can precinct committee, who lives five
miles away from the Orlean postoffice and
has a postoffice at his door. The only
change preferred against Mr. Anderson was,
that he was a democrat and believed in an
honest government, both State and national,
and was not afraid to stand by his convictions.

Mr. Anderson was endorsed by the
leading men of both political parties but
the petition sent to the Postoffice Depart-
ment, however, availed him nothing,
as Mahone and Postmaster Strother of War-
renton decreed that he must step down and
out. Be it said to the credit of ORLEAN
that all of the republicans combined
who voted for Mahone could not give the
required bond, \$1,000, and to give
the bond Mr. Moon had to call upon some
of the leading democrats to indorse for him.

Mr. L. L. Anderson has gone to Roanoke
and secured a lucrative position with the
N. & W. R. Co. Success to Len, whom
everybody remembers as one of the most
obliging postmasters Orlean has ever had.
A large acreage has already been plowed,
and our farmers are pushing their spring
work rapidly to the front. A few of our
people have, or imagine they have, the
grippe, or "grab," as one of our farmers
terms it.
