The King's Daughters.

On a January day in the year 1886 a little group of women sat talking together in a parlor in New York. Out of the talk grew a purpose to band themselves together in a sisterhood of service, and a pledge that whatever reasonable request should be asked by friend, stranger or enemy "In His Name," whatever service needed, small or great, it should be granted without question or delay. And one proposed that they should call themselves "King's Daughters," and another that the symbol of their order should be a tiny Maltese cross of silver tied with the royal color. Never was silver said or written, and never was progress accomplished so silently, secretly and rapidly as in this order of King's Daughters, which is now taking on new membership at the rate of two thousand each month. Little silver crosses flashed out here and there beneath the jeweled insignia of place on one breast, against the gaudy tatters of poverty on another. These wearers of the cross were organized in tens by the first ten, who were called the Central Council, or Ten, and were the nucleus about which all the others radiated. But the membership grew so large that ten was an insufficient number to comprise a circle, which sometimes contained fifty or one hundred members. Now there are more than 125,000 members. A band of King's Sons are included in the order. Eighteen States and three provinces in Canada have been organized into separate departments, with each a Secretary at the head. The order has rapidly extended and now embraces councils in Australia and the Sandwich Islands, New Zealand, India, China, Japan, Cuba, Mexico, Europe, Asia, and all parts of North America.

ARREST OF A VODOO DOCTOR.—Jack Moore, a negro, 80 years old, is in jail at Tuscaloosa, Ala., on a charge of disturbing the peace. Old Jack is a voodoo doctor, and was arrested on complaint of a number of negroes who say that he has conjured them. When arrested he carried a large sack, which was partly filled with voodoo medicine. The charms consist of salt, horse hair, fish hooks, briar roots, snake teeth, and rabbits' feet. Each package was tied with a red flannel rag. A few nights ago old Jack gave a voodoo dance, which was largely attended by colored people of both sexes. The day after the dance a number of those who attended the dance complained of feeling sick, and they decided they had been conjured. They at once had Jack arrested. He claims to be able to cure all diseases and to bring good or evil luck to any one at will.

THE ANGLICAN PORTUGUESE TROUBLE.

The present trouble between Great Britain and Portugal started in religion indirectly. The first English encroachment upon the territory that England now claims, of which the Portuguese had taken possession a couple of hundred years ago, was in the shape of a mission of the Free Church of Scotland, established on an island in Lake Nyassa in Africa, in 1859. The Portuguese made no opposition to this institution, and, in fact, rather favored it. The missionaries quickly built up a little town, Lukoma, on their island, and commerce and industry following after them, spread out the settlements of Europeans over the rich country west of the coast, where great plantations of coffee and sugar cane were started. Lukoma is now quite an important town, and is practically the centre of the district, which is in dispute.

IN LOVE WITH QUEEN NATALIE.—The nephew of the King of Romania and heir to the throne has fallen desperately in love with Queen Natalie of Serbia, to the intense vexation of the royal family. The Prince is bent upon marrying Natalie, whom he regards as the greatest heroine and martyr of the age, and close watch is kept to prevent a clandestine marriage.

ASSAULTED BY WOMEN.—Charles Rowland, a young married man, who, it is alleged, has driven his wife from his home by continued ill treatment, was waylaid by several women living in the Shoron, Pa., neighborhood, at midnight as he was removing his furniture and assaulted with stones and weapons of every kind, and then treated to an hour's serenade with tin horns, &c.
