Personal Explanations. A meeting of the State Agricultural Society in Richmond last Wednesday Colonel Robert Beverly, of Fauquier, who was president of the Agricultural Society for several years, arose to a question of personal privilege and was recognized by the Chair.

"I object to his being introduced here as Colonel Beverly," said Major Norman Randolph; "there are men here who were in the battlefield. He was never in the army, and is not a Colonel."

There was some excitement at this remark and Colonel Beverly, continuing to speak, said: "I am much obliged to the gentleman for the correction, very much obliged." He said that he understood that the president had been bitter in his remarks about him at the last meeting. He (Beverly) had published in the Southern Planter an article in which he had used an inappropriate term, and he was very sorry for it. He had used the word "bogu" in referring to stock, but he did not mean fraud. He had heard that some \$9,000 of stock had been subscribed for, and not paid for. This was done to start the exposition. He would now gladly correct the error if it were not being present at the meeting, and it had been said that it was his duty to have been there. He had no notice. He claimed that he came as soon as he received notice, and that was while he was on the cars, but he did not care for this. He had by this agitation of the subject now under consideration, caused a step to be taken which would clear the title of the property, which heretofore had long rested under a cloud. This done, the association could borrow money, and prevent the sale. He was paying every dollar of the debt. The institution was founded by the farmers of Virginia, and he wanted it saved from sale, and a clear title to it perfected, and he wanted the society to join in the petition to the court to grant the injunction restraining the sale, and settle the matter by a friendly suit. [Applause.]

The Chair asked Colonel Beverly for the name of his informant in regard to subscriptions not paid up.

Colonel Beverly replied, "Mr. John P. Branch." He was talking to him about a meeting of the stockholders, the second one after the exposition, and Mr. Branch said there would be no meeting. He asked Mr. Branch why the debt had not been paid, and he had replied there was an amount of bogus stock out.

Mr. Branch said Colonel Beverly had misunderstood him in toto. He did say that all the stock had not been subscribed for. He checked for it, and he said "paid for," for this was not true. He did not know how much was not subscribed for and not paid for. He did not believe Colonel Beverly would have made a statement he did not believe to be true, but the Colonel had totally misunderstood him - Richmond Times.
