Why Not a Southern Man?
We read stray paragraphs in democratic newspapers to the probable nominee of the democratic party for the next Presidency and note the paucity of names—Mr. Cleveland, of course; Governor Hill, with a check-in-the-face following; that fine old bit of well-seasoned wintergreen, Palmer, of Illinois an ex-republican, and from Indiana another ex-republican named Gray, who seems to be as grotesque a figure in Western politics as his prototype, Elijah P. Morgan.
This is a barren list of leaders of a party which used to enter a convention led by giants like Douglas, Cass, Benton, Calhoun, Van Buren, Marcy, Seymour, Chase and Randall. And democrats may well ask, "Where are our leaders?"
The trouble is that from these Presidential lists the South is excluded. The ablest men in the democratic party are from the South. We note this in both branches of Congress. Yet the South is excluded from consideration in a democratic convention because of a rebellion which ended twenty-five years ago. There is the cowardly fear that if the convention should take any one of us, let us say, twenty brilliant and conspicuous southern men, the "Rally Round the Flag," "Marching Through Georgia," "John Brown" business would be revived. The old soldier would come to the front, and the calm political judgment of to-day would be overcome by the smouldering fires of warlike passions.
We do not believe it. The American people want a chance to vote for the best democrat among democrats, or the best republican among republicans, and what part either candidate may have taken in the rebellion will have no effect upon their judgment. The southern democrats are foolish if they do not insist upon political rights which have too long been neglected.

Well-Trained Lions.
Describing a circus performance in Paris *Le Temps* says: Darling, a tall, handsome fellow, accompanied by a splendid mastiff, now steps in the arena. He cracks his whip, a few revolver shots are fired, and in they rush straight from the stable—Leo, Tom, Pasha and Sultan—four magnificent samples of African kingly of the desert. As soon as they catch sight of their master they are as quiet as lambs. One of them stands on his hind legs, places his forepaws on Darling's shoulders and licks his face. They then squat on a couple of benches, each awaiting the signal to go through his performance. After a few preliminary exercises a number of stands or pedestals were placed close together and the five animals executed a series of tableaux vivants with striking effect. On being sent back to their places three of the lions obeyed the injunction, but the second of the group remained where he was. As neither coaxing or entreaties availed Darling simply threw his protegee over his shoulder and carried him to his place. A swing plank was introduced on which the merry performers disported themselves for awhile. Sitting upright on their stands they had afterward to hold out flags spread out from one to the other, over which the mastiff jumped to mighty leaps. When at last to all appearances tired with their labors, they all lay down together, Darling gracefully reclined on the soft couch and Nero, the dog, skipped around, barking merrily at the charming picture of still life. After a short repose Tom mounts a tricycle without assistance and sets it going with his forepaws; Leo assists his comrade by pushing behind, and off they start all around the ring. Meanwhile Darling puts the harness on the other pair, using silk ribbons for bridles. He mounts his cheriot, flourishes the whip and at a furious gallop they dash around the arena. The door is suddenly opened and the performance is at an end.
