PHOTOGRAPHED AN ANGEL.—A dispatch from Charlotte, N. C., says a portrait of the late John Taylor which J. R. Smith has on exhibition in his store attracts many visitors daily and has caused a great deal of discussion. The portrait formerly rested on the mantelpiece at Mr. Smith's residence in Mt. Olive. One day during a heavy storm a lightning flash struck it. The frame was demolished, but the flash left on the portrait a clearly defined picture of an angel with outstretched wings overshadowing Mr. Taylor's head, the arms encircling his neck and the right hand holding a bunch of flowers. The picture of the angel suggests protection and benediction. The dark line showing the lightning's journey along the cardboard tapers abruptly just above the face of Mr. Taylor, giving the spectator the idea that the angel changed the lightning's course. Superstitious people consider it an indication that Mr. Taylor is in heaven, but Mr. Smith explains the phenomenon by saying that the picture of an angel, exactly like that which appears on the Taylor portrait, was on the back of a photograph near by. He believes that by some electric freak the picture of the angel was photographed over the portrait. The affair, however, has caused a great deal of comment, and people from miles around come to see the picture.
