**ACRIMMAGE AT A WEDDING.**—A Waterbury, Ct., at Thursday Timothy Moriarty and Miss Bridget Lynch were joined in the bonds of wedlock. After the ceremony the happy pair adjourned to the house of the bride, where a reception was held. There was plenty of eating and drinking, more drinking than eating judging from the events of the night. Among the guests were Michael and Patrick Curran. Michael had officiated as best man at the wedding, and therefore had the seat of honor at the left of the bride. The liquid refreshment seemed to have a peculiar effect on the guests. It made Michael swear that he would be a bachelor no longer than the first opportunity offered for him to get a girl and wed. He suddenly took a great liking for Moriarty's wife, and between every mouthful would implant a kiss on the ripe, rosy lips of the bride. Moriarty stood by for some time until he thought that Michael was getting more than his share, and the gallant Mike, however, Moriarty finally became desperate and pushed him away, whereupon Mike raised a cry, which quickly brought his brother Patrick to his aid. Patrick, thinking that his brother was getting hurt, jumped for the newly made husband, and with one blow of his fist knocked him and the table with all the good things flying. Then the acrimmage became general and continued until a squad of officers arrived, who put the three fighters under arrest. **WHERE THE BLACKBIRDS ROOST.**—For the past few weeks, just about sundown every evening, the people of this neighborhood have noticed great flocks of blackbirds winging their flight from all directions toward Shepherdstown. The objective point for the birds was Elmwood Cemetery, at the edge of town, where, among the many trees of all kinds, they had established a regular roosting place. Thousands upon thousands of birds congregated in the cemetery, and as they flew in great flocks they uttered a low, low, low, and their ceaseless chattering could be heard a great distance. The birds only took a short time to become a great nuisance. The foliage was injured, the tombstones and monuments were defaced, the walks made almost impassable on account of the litter, and the air became very impure. The clean, shady, inviting spot was becoming a filthy rookery, and it was decided to drive the birds out. Monday evening Superintendent Maddox, with a number of helpers, armed with shotguns, began work on the birds. As the guns began to crack and the birds were disturbed the uproar became deafening, but by the time a good many had been shot the others had been frightened away. Tuesday evening the birds returned as usual, but the same reception awaited them, and they were soon put to flight. They have gotten fewer and fewer each evening, most of them going up to the cliff, above town, where they will be allowed to "roost in peace." It is thought that they will be permanently dislodged from the cemetery in a few days more—*Shepherdstown Register.*
