Fairfax Democrats.

Fairfax O. H., Sept. 17.—According to announcement the democrats of Old Fairfax turned out on Monday last to open the fall campaign and listen to speeches from distinguished democrats. James M. Love, esq., our popular and efficient Commonwealth's attorney and chairman of the party, being temporarily absent, Senator R. W. Moore presided and introduced the Hon. Obaas E. Hooker, M. C. from Mississippi, who delivered a powerful speech in which he showed conclusively that it was much better for the entire country to be ruled by the democratic party than by the republican party.  
He was followed by that young, true and tried democrat, Sen. or R. W. Moore, who delivered one of the best speeches he ever made (and this is saying a great deal) in which he showed up and handled the republican party without gloves and paid a high compliment to our congressman, Gen. Lee, and said he would be triumphantly elected in November next. He also paid a high compliment to the sterling democracy of the county and predicted that as in time past they would turn out and give the ticket a rousing majority and thus put the seal of condemnation on the effort to defeat the nominee.  
Both the speeches were attentively listened to and well received and will do much good.

From November 1st to February 1st: Accomac, Allegany, Amherst, Augusta, Bath, Bedford, Caroline, Essex, Franklin, Grayson, Highland, Nansmond, Norfolk, Rockbridge, Scott, Smyth, Washington, and Wythe.  
From October 15th to January 15th: Albemarle, Alexandria, Buckingham, Buchanan, Campbell, Charles City, Charlotte, Chesterfield, Clarke, Elizabeth City, Fairfax, Fauquier, Fluvanna, Gloucester, Goodland, Greene, James City, King George, King William, Louisa, Madison, Mathews, Middlesex, Nelson, New Kent, Northumberland, Orange, Patrick, Pittsylvania, Powhatan, Prince George, Prince William, Rappahannock, Spotsylvania, Stafford, Surry, Warwick, Westmoreland, and York.

NOW HE IS A HEBREW.—Vere V. Hunt, a lawyer and politician of Chicago, has become a Hebrew. The ceremony admitting him to the Jewish faith was performed last Sunday, and henceforth he will be known among the children of Judah as Israel Isaac Osterheimer. This name, as is the custom of the ceremony of circumcision, was given him by the rabbi. By some of his acquaintances "Osterheimer" is considered erratic, a man of whims and quick emotions. Others, however, say that he is of uncommon brilliancy and hard philosophical thought. Since his arrival in Chicago, it is said, he has been in turn a republican, a democrat, a prohibitionist and an anarchist. "But I am neither of these," he said yesterday. "I am a socialist and a H-brew." He was educated for the Episcopal ministry, and his Hebrew studies in that connection finally led to his conversion. Hunt is the man who, during the anarchist excitement in 1884 and 1885, attempted to get out a writ of habeas corpus for Louis Lingg after that desperate character had blown his head off in his cell at the county jail. He is to marry a Jewess.
