He Got Her Heart at Last

The grand jury of Chittenden county, Vt., has just returned a true bill against Dr. Armand Patenaude, of Wisconsin, for grave robbing.

The doctor is of a prominent French-Canadian family and came to Wisconsin to practice three years ago. There he met Katherine Collins, a farmer's daughter, noted for her beauty. Patenaude fell instantly in love with her, and was devoted to the attention of his young neighbor. As usual, the woman loved another, but this did not deter the young Canadian, and one day, when he was employing her "to give him her heart," she replied that she would, some time; and when he asked the time she said: "When I am dead." Dr. Patenaude said, "Do you mean it?" and she laughingly said "Yes."

Last week Miss Collins was taken suddenly ill from pneumonia. Dr. Patenaude attended her and tried to save her life, but she died and was buried in the parish church-yard. The next night the sexton, seeing the grave had been disturbed, made an investigation, and the body was found gone. The entire country embarked in a search, and the corpse was found in the woods, but the heart was missing. A countryman arrested on suspicion confessed having helped Dr. Patenaude to rob the grave. The body was taken to his office and something cut out, which was placed in a bottle of alcohol. The doctor got wind of the confession and fled to Canada, taking his bottle with him. It is supposed he had claimed his due, the dead heart. News from Canada says he is acting queerly there, and it is supposed he has lost his mind over his wild infatuation. The body was turned and a reward offered for Patenaude's arrest or the recovery of the heart.

Assault Cases in Spotsylvania County.

Last Wednesday Big John Lewis was arraigned in the county before Justice Bolander under a bench warrant issued by Judge Waller at the last term of his court in the county, charging Lewis with committing a violent assault upon a white girl about 17 years of age who lives on Mr. Lewis' farm. It is said that the evidence before the justice for and against the accused was quite conflicting, yet sufficiently strong to cause the justice to recognize Lewis in the sum of \$500 to appear at the next term of the county court of Spotsylvania to answer further the charge. The general impression is that the trial of Lewis before a jury will be attended with great interest by the people generally of the county and especially those of the girl's neighborhood, and that her friends are determined to prosecute the alleged offense to the fullest extent of the law.

In that county also on Friday last, at the Grange Hall, John Gardner and Willie Reed, both white, and Ardie Young, colored, were arraigned before Justice Charities under a similar charge on the person of a Miss Clara Jett, of the county also, a white girl about 15 years of age. The story told by the girl substantially was that these three men met her on the public highway in March last, and dragged her into a dense forest near by, where they committed the assault in spite of her fierce struggles to prevent it. At the trial, however, the prosecution, to the amazement of all present, signed a paper setting forth that the accused not only did not commit the alleged act, but never made the attempt, whereupon the accused parties were discharged to go without day.—Fredericksburg Lance.
