**Senator Hampton's Experience With Horses**  
Senator Wade Hampton is reported as saying: "When I went to the war in 1861 I took with me three thoroughbred stallions that were worth a prince's ransom. One was as black as night, one was a dark chestnut, and the other was a chestnut sorrel. You are perhaps aware that my father was not only a noted importer of running hores, but a famous breeder of the thoroughbred as well. I rode the black stallion at the first Bull-run battle, where I commanded the Hampton Legion, comprised of infantry, cavalry and artillery. At the famous cavalry fight at Brandy Station with Pleasanton, in 1863, I rode the chestnut. He was a hard horse to control in a charge, and he nearly carried me into the enemy's lines on that day twice. I rode the chestnut sorrel at the great cavalry fight in the rear of Meade's army on the third day at Gettysburg, and came near meeting the same fate as that I escaped from at Brandy Station a few weeks previous. My experience with thoroughbreds is in times of war that they are safer horses to get away from the enemy with than when you are going toward him, especially when on a palpit. But when it comes to endurance and thoroughbred will kill three cold-blooded horses in a campaign. They will go farther with less food, go faster and show more courage in the face of danger. I have ridden the stallions I mention into federal batteries, and they never once flinched. All of them were wounded three or four times, but they pulled through. I think a body of men mounted on entire blooded horses would prove much more formidable in a charge than the same force mounted on geldings of the same blood. Our spongers in the ancient times always went to war on entire horses, and in order that their presence might not be betrayed to the enemy, their nostrils were slit so that they could not neigh. The Arabs in their journey prefer entire horses, as they seem to have more courage, sense, strength and endurance than mares or geldings. The late John Morgan owed his success in the late war to the fact that in his raids his men were mounted on Kentucky thoroughbreds."

**News FROM JAPAN.**—The steamship China arrived at San Francisco yesterday from China and Japan, bringing Chinese advices to November 13 and Japanese advices to November 21. The details of the blowing up on November 21 of the government powder mills at Tai-Ping-Foo are meager, but agree in stating that three hundred lives were lost, and all the houses in the vicinity were wrecked. Fifty persons are said to have been at work in the mills at the time of the accident, and of their remains only two limbs have been found. The cause of the explosion is unknown. One-half of the city of P.-Chow, in the Province of Anui, is reported destroyed by fire, originating from another powder explosion. A boat containing the captain and fourteen men of the crew of the Japanese training ship Monju capsized off the coast of Japan recently, and all were drowned but one.

The influenza has reappeared at Tokio. The cholera is fast disappearing.  
On the 9th of November a train overturned at Okayan, killing and wounding twenty-six persons.  
**HE SLAPPED THE PRINCE'S FACE.**—Pittsburgh boasts of a man who slapped the Prince of Wales in the face. For many years he has worked for the Monongahela Water Company as a laboring boss. The circumstances of the adventure as told by himself are as follows: "In my early life I was a soldier in the British army, and once my regiment was reviewed by Queen Victoria, who held by the hand the youthful Prince of Wales. When the mother's back was turned the boy playfully experecated on my new red coat, and I resented the insult to the British flag by slapping him in the face with my open palm. He told his mother, and very soon the Colonel heard of it and came dancing along to wreak vengeance on the man who dare lift his hand to a son of the Queen. The Queen sought me out and graciously inquired what my name was. 'William D'keen, your majesty,' said I, and she commended my sense of propriety in administering a timely rebuke to the heir apparent of the English throne, and recommended me for the promotion which never came."
