Ingalls' Romantic Election

Barney O'Driscoll, a prominent mine owner from Silverton, while discussing the Kansas situation in the Windsor lobby in Denver, Col., on Monday night said: "John J. Ingalls would never have been elected to the United States Senate had it not been for a pretty girl." After some coaxing Driscoll was prevailed upon to tell the story which is as follows: "Twenty-five years ago I was a resident of Douglas county, Texas, and in the fall of 1872 was chosen Representative from that district on the democratic ticket. There were two candidates in the field for United States Senator—Ingalls and O'D. Bland Pomerooy. Pomerooy was well known and an ex Senator with a large following, while Ingalls was comparatively unknown. Our side being hopelessly in the minority we cut no figure in the contest, but I went to the capital in January, 1873 with instructions to cast the solid democratic vote for any good, clean man put up, and of course I was looked as the keystone of the situation. Ingalls had been accused of attempting to bribe Judge Daley, and his opponents were using this against him. Just before the caucus Governor Osborne saw the daughter of Judge Daley, who was the belle of the State, and fell madly in love with her. He raved over her and asked one of Ingalls' friends to introduce him. The friend replied: 'O'Driscoll will vote for Ingalls if you will do it you shall have the introduction.' The Executive agreed. I was sent for and received the following explanation: Judge Daley sometimes took too much toddy, and while in that playful condition based by an overdose of stimulants had thrown one of Ingalls' cases out of court. The latter went to Osborne, who was a more experienced lawyer, and employed him to get the case reinstated. He gave Osborne \$500 for doing the work, but for some reason the matter was never clearly stated and Ingalls rested under a cloud. I went into the session next day and cast the vote that elected Ingalls. Osborne was introduced to and one year afterwards married the pretty girl who made Ingalls Senator."

BATTLE WITH A BIRD—Thomas Shelby, a farmer living eight miles out from Lexington, Ky., on the Richmond turnpike, had a desperate encounter with a wounded eagle recently.

He was out riding over his farm when he discovered a large bird perched on the top-most limb of a tree. At the first glance he thought the bird to be a black buzzard, but as he drew nearer he concluded that it must be an eagle. He noticed that the bird kept eyeing his dogs, which were near the tree. Shelby took advantage of this fact and rode up close to the tree on the opposite side from the dog. He had his shotgun with him loaded with small shot. When he reached a point about thirty rods from the tree he fired. The eagle came crashing down through the branches and Shelby ran to pick it up. The load of shot was too small to do more than disable the bird by breaking its wings.

As Shelby approached the bird of freedom turned and dashed at him with the ferocity of a tiger. By rapid dodging he managed to keep out of reach of the bird's claws for several moments. He finally picked up a fallen limb, and each time the bird dashed at him he avoided it and struck and raised effective blows upon the vicious bird of freedom. It was not, however, until he had mangled its head almost to a jelly that the bird gave up the fight. Shelby escaped with a number of scratches and took the bird to Lexington, where it was placed on exhibition. It is of the species known as the gray eagle and is the first one killed in that part of the country for many years. It weighed 17 pounds and measured nearly 7 feet from tip to tip.—Cincinnati Enquirer.
