**Hawaii's Volcano in Action.**

The steamer Australia from Honolulu, brings advices to June 2.

The volcano is in an exceptional favorable condition. The bottom of Halemau-mau is fast filling up with lava. There is a lake now, apparently from 250 to 300 feet long and nearly as wide. The empty portion of the pit, recently estimated at 500 feet deep, is now over 400, and the whole crater is now undergoing a daily transformation.

While the queen was at the volcano some officious kahuna, or native seers, the direct descendant of the ancient heathen priesthood, performed at night a sacrifice to the goddess Pele. It was a strange and weird spectacle. The pit was all ablaze below; the sky was all aglow above. The kahuna, in their fantastic attire and strange motions, showed up distinct in the glare of kaleidoscopic color from the molten mass below.

Ever and again from the chief active cone a huge jet of molten lava would be hurled 100 feet into midair. By some strange illusion it seemed to rise slowly and sink down as gradually as though it were buoyed up by some invisible fluid. It spread out at the top like a huge palm tree of fire, its rays as the rush of many waters. The play of colors was absolutely indescribable. After a time the surface of the lava grew dull in color. In an incredibly short space it blackened. Soon the crust cracked, and zigzag lines of glowing light appeared. They looked exactly like the forked lightning upon the bosom of the black thunder cloud. The lines of light increased and widened. The surface of the frozen sea was agitated from beneath. Great flocks of the black ice reared up on edge, and slowly sank from sight. Again it was a tossing sea of fire. Again with burst of thunder sound the fiery palm tree raised its flaming head a hundred feet above the jagged sea. The roaring billows flung themselves upon the jagged rocks that hemmed them in. The fiery spray flashed and scintillated till the mighty column fell. The sea grew black. And so on and on over and over again the awful scene repeated itself, till the dazzled eyes were well nigh blinded.

When the sea of fire was its brightest the weird kahuna, with strange incantations and fantastic gestures, flung into its awful billows their living sacrifices, two pigs, a chicken and a square-shouldered bottle of gin. The pigs went in with a plunk and were lost forever. Immediately afterward there was a burst that threw the lava 15 or 20 feet into the air. Something evidently exploded, possibly a pig. This was looked upon as an unlucky omen, and a feeling of commiseration took possession of the company. The chicken was next cast in. He floated a moment on the surface ere he was consumed. Though we did not hear, it is almost certain that the unfortunate rooster squawked once. This was a better omen. Hawaiian chances were decidedly looking up. Then the most precious gift of all, the bottle of gin (duty \$8 a gallon), was offered up to the rapacious goddess of fire.
