When Postmaster General Wanamaker sent some of his "trusty" agents to Baltimore to investigate the charges and specifications which Commissioner Roosevelt, of the civil service commission, had brought against the republican postmaster at Baltimore, whom he accused of gross and flagrant violation of the civil service law, every body who knew any thing at all about Mr. Wanamaker expected nothing else than a whitewashed report; but hardly any body who had not fathomed the true depth of his character supposed that he would go so far as to have a report prepared recommending the removal of Mr. Roosevelt for bringing the charges referred to and for asking them public. No matter what amount Mr. Roosevelt may be on the subject of civil service reform, every body at all acquainted with him knows him to be thoroughly honest, personally and officially, and that he does all he can to have the civil service law executed honestly and efficiently. But that is exactly what the present administration does not want, for to have it so would militate seriously against its retention of power, and so Mr. Roosevelt is recommended for removal. This is heard on Mr. Roosevelt, but as any thing that will bring discredit and ridicule upon the civil service reform hanging, and tend to the repeal of the civil service law, is approved by a large majority of the people of the country, he will receive little or no sympathy.

As the House of Representatives is largely democratic and was made so by the votes of the people against the high tariff by which they are plundered, it should, by all means, as soon after its organization as possible, pass a bill to repeal that tariff. Of course such a bill could not become a law with a republican Senate and a republican President against it, but its passage would show the people that the democrats would do for their relief if they were not opposed by the republicans. But having done that, they should at once proceed to pass individual bills to remove the tariff tax on single articles of prime necessity, one for instance to remove the tax on salt, another one to remove that on wool, another on fuel, and so on. There is only a small republican majority in the Senate, and so urgent are the demands of the poor people, of republican as well as of democratic States, for relief, that enough republican Senators will be found whose votes, joined with those of their democratic colleagues, will be sufficient to accomplish the desired purpose. An attempt to remove the tax on all the protected articles at once would meet with the combined opposition of all who profit by that tax, but such would not be the case were attacks made upon them in detail.

It is said that Mr. Mills is in favor of an income tax to make up any deficit in the revenue that may result from a reduction in the tariff tax on the necessities of life and raw material. Whether he is or not, there is no doubt of the fact that such a tax would be popular with nine-tenths of the people of the country, who are poor, no matter how unpopular it might be with the other one-tenth, who are rich, and, where every man has a vote, nine will beat one every time. Why southern men should oppose such a tax, when nearly all the wealth of the country is in the North, is one of the many strange things of this strange eventful age. Were such a tax imposed for the payment of pensions, the devices to which the pension agents resort for increasing the pensions account would soon become inoperative.

ONE of the Washington newspapers says that "democrats seem to be determined to have the New York Senate, whether they elected it or not." Oh no! The right way to put it would be to say that the democrats seem to be determined to prevent the republicans from stealing the New York Senate, a majority of the members of which body they, the democrats, have fairly and legally elected. The republicans take the Presidency, or, as Mr. Heriot says, bought it; they stole the Montana Senatorship, and they stole the Governorships of Connecticut and Nebraska; but it seems that the democrats of New York are determined to prevent them from stealing the Senate of that State—for which they deserve and receive the thanks of all the other democrats in the country.

Yale defeated Princeton yesterday for the intercollegiate football championship on Manhattan field, New York, by the score of 19 to 0. Neither side scored in the first half, and all of Yale's gains were made in the latter part of the contest.

General Palmer, commander-in-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, opens his batteries anew upon the flag of the late Confederacy. He said in a speech yesterday that "in doing honor to the people of the South, they should not confront us with that—[a striking old rag of treason]."

No information in regard to the reported massacre of Christians in northern China has been received at the Chinese legation in Washington. The secretary of the legation said that he believed the trouble was exaggerated. Such a massacre, if it really occurred, he said, was an event of the greatest moment to the Chinese government, and the legation would, he thought, be immediately notified of it.

To Lay Siege to Peking. A Shanghai dispatch says that great excitement prevails in Peking over the situation to the north. The Chinese government had not anticipated any trouble in that quarter among the Mongolian tribes upon whom the empire has been largely dependent for recruits for its armies. These tribesmen are very proud, claiming descent from the great conqueror, Genghis Khan. It appears that the board of foreign affairs at Peking, which has overgrown in Mongolia, attempted, several months ago, to establish new and stricter rules for the government of the Mongoles, refusing the chiefs of the various divisions to pay obedience to the Chinese Governor at Peking, and otherwise interfering with the long-established customs of the tribes. This has aroused great discontent, and some of the chiefs refused to pay the usual tribute. Troops were sent against them, but they vanquished the soldiers, and it is now said they are advancing in the direction of Peking, with the intention of establishing a new dynasty. They are organized battalions, although not disciplined, and are able to vanquish any but the best troops in the Chinese service.

The outbreak in Mongolia appears to have no connection with the conspiracy and insurrection in China proper, which continue to defy the power and seize the attention of the government. These appear to be distinct and independent enterprises, although there is said to be a movement against the Chinese dynasty similar to that which prompted the Taiping rebellion.

The Chinese armistice in better condition than ever before, but the government does not seem sure of its loyalty. Should any general disaffection gain ground among the troops in Manchuria, where the flower of the army is stationed to watch the movements of Russia, the chances for the dynasty would be almost hopeless.

Brides Stolen Away. An earnest appeal has been presented to the Armenian patriarch to use his influence in behalf of the Christian women and girls of Armenia, who are being carried off in large numbers by the Kurds. It appears that women are scarce among the wild tribesmen, who, when they want wives, swoop down on some Armenian neighborhood and carry away all the good looking young women they can find, thus leaving to the Armenian men only the less attractive. In several instances the Kurds have broken in on wedding parties and carried the brides off from the feast or church. It is believed that the Kurd tribesmen nearly all have Armenian wives, judging from the number stolen, although it is intimated that they dispose of the surplus at a fair market price for Turkish and Persian harems.

The Turkish authorities are accused of encouraging the Kurds in their lawlessness, and instead of trying to catch and punish the raiders they arrest and imprison the Armenians who resist them. One Armenian father at Sivas, blessed with four daughters, went to the wall to seek for protection, as he feared a visit from the Kurds, and was seized and kept in prison for a week. When he was released his daughters were gone; whether taken by the Turks or Kurds he could not discover. Hence the appeal to the patriarch, whom the Armenians expect to help them by his influence with the Porte. The patriarch, whether he is afraid of the Turks or not, as some of his enemies charge, takes but a languid interest in the subject.

Suicide in Court. A fearful tragedy occurred yesterday at the Newcastle, England, Assizes. A man named Baker, who has heretofore held a responsible position in society, was convicted of an unnatural crime. He had shown great agitation during the trial, and when the verdict of guilty was announced he seemed utterly downcast. Mr. Justice Lawrence, who presided, sentenced the prisoner to ten years' penal servitude. The prisoner's relatives were in the court-room, and they, too, manifested deep emotion, which seemed to have an additional depth arising from the fact that Baker was leaving the dock in charge of the wardens he waved a farewell to his relatives and almost instantly fell unconscious into the arms of one of the wardens. Medical aid was instantly summoned, but it was too late. Baker died almost instantly, before he could be carried from the court-room. The greatest excitement reigned in the court-room, and the judge ordered proceedings to be stopped for a time to give time for the sensation to subside. The jury which convicted Baker were witnesses of his suicide and some of the dead man's relatives did not hesitate to denounce the jury as having convicted him wrongfully, and thereby driven him to his desperate deed. It was found that Baker had swallowed a deadly dose of poison.

BATTLE WITH A BEAR.—A section man was coming into Columbus, Ind., yesterday afternoon, on a hand-car on the Pennsylvania road, when he was attacked by a large bear. A terrible storm was in progress at the time. The man and bear had a terrific struggle, but the man finally struck the bear over the head with an iron crowbar, and the animal rolled from the car the man got to motion and escaped. He was badly scratched and bruised, but not seriously injured.

William R. Ray, editor of the Winchester Times, died yesterday morning in Dallas. He was on an excursion through western Texas with the Virginia Press Association. His wife and daughter were with him. The immediate cause of his death was exhaustion from travel.

Major Mann Page, president of the Virginia Farmers' Alliance, yesterday returned to Richmond from Indianapolis, where he went as delegate to the national convention. He says the sentiment of that body was against any third-party move, except among some of the delegates from the northwestern States. This was particularly the case in Kansas and Illinois.

The largest and most successful diamond-back terrapin farm in the United States is on Hog Head, near the village of Lawless. The island is situated at the mouth of Coan river, and its name was suggested by the large number of frogs which in olden days roared along its shore. The farm, which is at the head of a small bay which makes in from Coan river, covers about 2 1/2 acres of water and land. The entire space is surrounded by a closely fitting fence made of pine boards about 12 to 14 inches in width, which are driven in the ground about three feet in order to prevent the terrapin from digging their way out. At the upper end of the pond is a large waste-gate made of copper wire. Through four wire doors at the lower end of the pond the water of Coan river passes in and out as the tide rises or falls.

An Ex-Confederate Starved. A letter from New York says: "Where such fare is provided for the public, it would appear incredible that people could starve to death in New York. One case of recent happening is sufficient.
