**The Tiny Spherical Watch.**  
Since the watch has once more been promoted to a place of honor in my lady's jewel casket, and appears upon her shoulder on occasions of state, the useful little monitor of the flight of time has taken on most frivolous airs and graces. The winding hands and circle of hours are hidden away in a tiny ball of sparkling jewels, diamonds, rubies, or turquoise, and it swings from a pin of great price and rare workmanship. Some of the tiny watches take the form of a flower, a pansy enamelled in the purple and yellow of the heartsease. There are other watches covered entirely with the glossy and beautiful enamel which comes in rich red and deep blue. These watches have wreaths and sprays of diamond-set flowers and leaves festooned across the case. One very beautiful little watch has a large diamond set in the centre of a circle of the blue enamel, which in turn is framed in a ring of diamonds. Medals, bouquets, the exquisite French enamel are framed in diamonds on the case, and some watches are encrusted with pearls in which is traced a pattern in sapphires or emeralds, for those vivid green stones are once more restored to fashionable favor. Less expensive are the cases of polished gold enamelled with a spray of flowers in natural colors, or with the cypher traced in diamonds. There are two ways of wearing the pretty trinkets, whose ornamental possibilities far exceed their usefulness, since the mechanism of the toy timepieces is too delicate to long endure woman's unique methods of caring for a watch. You can't exactly depend upon a watch in the matter of keeping appointments and catching trains that is rarely wound except when its owner is starting out for a day's shopping or is going on a journey, that is dropped on the floor, thrown under the bed, and hangs dangling from a pin, where it is forgotten and left to run down for a week in the top drawer. One is to wear it on one of the long gold chains set with pearls at intervals of an inch. The chain is wound twice about the neck and the watch is thrust thru into the belt in the old-fashioned way if it is plain, or caught up on the shoulder with a jeweled pin if it has a handsome case. The other mode calls for a chateleine pin, jeweled like the watch, which is worn well up on the left side of the bodice, near the shoulder. The newest designs in pins are the dagger or scimitar with jeweled hilt, a gold dragon with jeweled eyes, a fleur-de-lis of precious stones, or a variation of the bow knot idea, which in the new pins is very irregular and fanciful in shape, and made of a ribbon enamelled on one side and set with pearls or diamonds on the other. Sometimes this bow has but two long loops starting out on one side, or many loops of very narrow ribbon are twisted together almost like a rosette. Her pins for the throat come in the dagger patterns with jeweled hilts and tips, and also in the bow knots of jewels or of pearls with the enamel showing inside the loops. Greatly desired of woman-kind are the stick pins, both in long and short forms, for two jeweled pins are really necessary to keep the hat in place, and a bonnet sometimes sports three or four of the shorter lengths. The veil, too, may be pinned with a diamond-set fleur-de-lis or loops of pearls or turquoise. Handsome stick pins of large size are used to fasten the collar at the left side, while buckles of high and low degree are among the actual necessities of life to the woman with any pretension to style. A very interesting buckle belt in silver is worn now by a well-known lady, cut in the Japanese letters which indicate on one side "Good health," on the other "Long life." Of course the favorite buckles are of pieced work, or filigree, in gold. Sometimes as high as \$100 is paid for a single buckle without the jewels. Hair ornaments increase in size, and also in price, with every fresh invoice. They follow the Colonial and 1830 patterns as well as the old Greek designs which prevailed at the French court when Napoleon wore the purple. Moonstones have gone out except when carved in elaborate patterns of loves and nymphs and set in diamonds. They are wearing a quaint little pin in Paris just now, an intaglio of Miss Helvet set in brilliants. But the new stone, the chrysoprase, which has succeeded them, is said also to bring luck to the wearer. This stone is somewhat like the aqua-marine, of a pale green color, but less clear in tone. Wonderful chains are made of small diamonds, pierced and strung between links of gold. They are nearly a yard long, and wound about the throat loosely. Earrings are little worn, especially among the younger women, and cluster designs are much used by matrons whose long use of the ear jewels has so distended the lobes of the ears as to make the ring almost a necessity.
