Rate Made Weds Again.

Kate Mott, a handsome woman of 30
years, was discharged two months ago
from the Kings county, N. Y., penitentiary,
where she had served a sentence
of one year for bigamy. She has dark
hair and eyes and a dashing manner.
She returned to the home of her mother,
in Wading River. There she came out
in her old style and dash in a way that
startled the young men of the village.
She wore handsome dresses, which,
it is said, formed part of the wedding
outfit when she married 19-year-old
D. Oliver Petty of Port Jefferson,
more than a year ago. It was that
wedding that brought her trouble, for
the older Mr. Petty locked his son up
at home and had the young woman
arrested for bigamy, as it was asserted
she had already three husbands living.

When she got out of prison lately
her good looks and fine dresses soon
drew admirers about her. Among them
was Henry Houseman, 24 years old,
a son of Solomon Houseman, business
man of Bay Shore. The young woman
made her home at the home of
Henry Jeffries in Bay Shore, and
Houseman's attentions to her were
in a subject for comment. Lincoln
Nigant, one of the former husbands of
the woman, is said to have expostulated
with Houseman against visiting her,
but apparently to no purpose, as the
couple are said to have left Bay Shore
on Monday morning on the 7:32 train for
Long Island City and to have started for
the far West the same day. The young
man's father, however, does not believe
his son has run away with the woman.
Several days after her disappearance
a Kickapoo Indian medicine man, with
whom the young woman is said to have
eloped when she was the wife of a
man named Fox, made his appearance
in the village, apparently in reply
to a communication. He evidently
was much disappointed when he
learned that his former companion had
disappeared.

given strong proofs of their skill and of their
courtesy, they had been dismissed, and were
now behind the house, out of sight, one trying
to stanch his wounds, the other stiff in death
